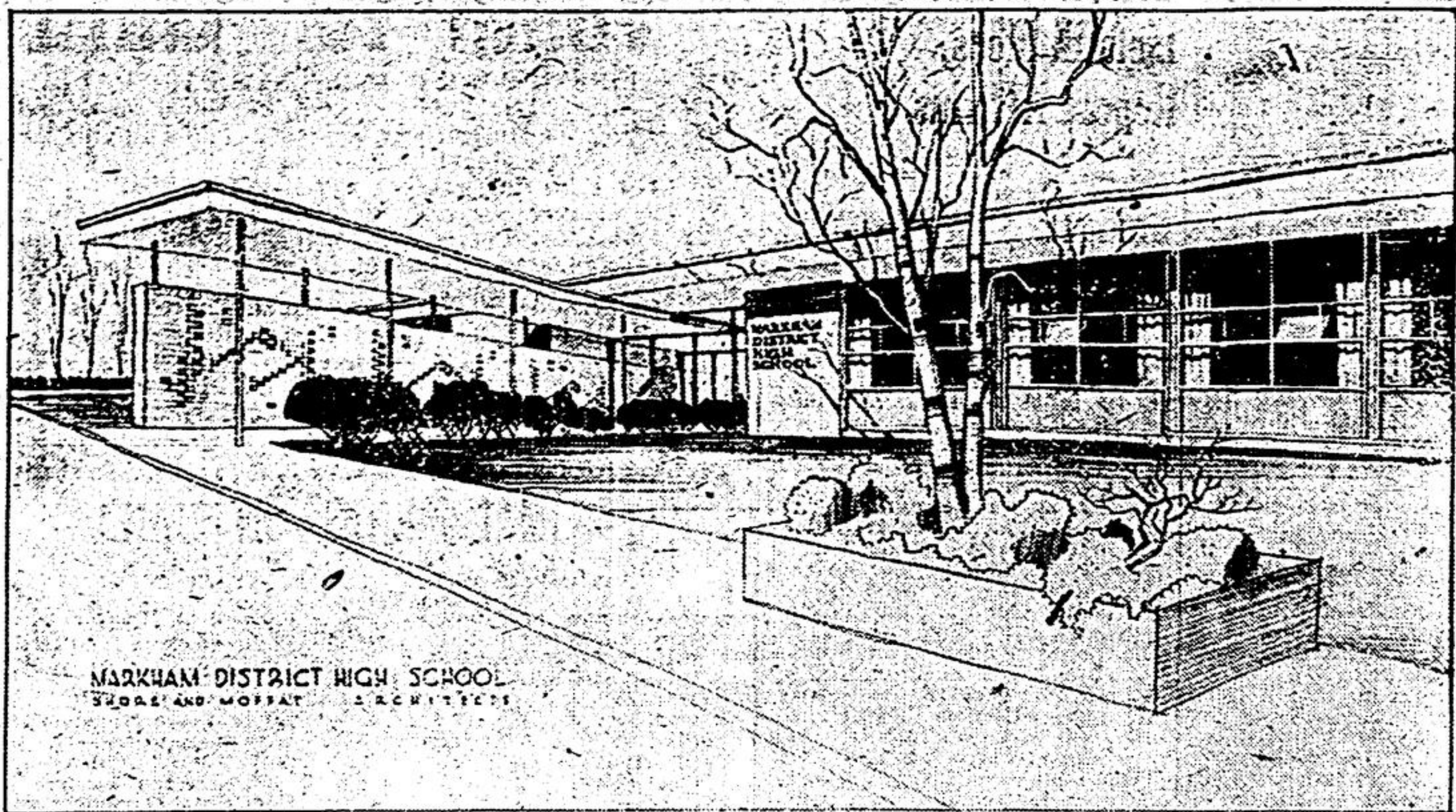


NEW MARKHAM DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOL, FRONT VIEW

From the Files of The Tribune 26 Years Ago  
Following a couple of days mild spell last week the sidewalks on Sunday and Monday were a glare of ice, and the roadways in many places were dangerous for automobile traffic. Many citizens tried the antics of stage acrobats, with more or less success in getting their feet above their heads. Fortunately no one has met with a serious fall.

On the eve of the Rae family relinquishing the pastmastership of the Stouffville post office after nearly fourteen years service, the staff and rural route couriers presented Miss Nettie Rae with an address and a handsome piece of cut glass, as a slight token of esteem in which she is held by them as their former postmistress. It is now about two weeks since a passenger bus has pulled into Stouffville although they run regularly from Markham to Toronto. There isn't much for them to get in the way of traffic at this time of the year.

The matter of selecting an overseer of roads occupied a great deal of the thought of Markham Township Council on Monday. Quite a number of applications have been received and a matter of selecting a man from among them was left over for a special meeting to be held in a few days. Eric Thompson, the present overseer or road superintendent receives a salary of \$90 per month, with a mileage of 12 cents.

Wm. Eckardt's auction sale of farm stock and implements at Glasgow realized \$2,650, a remarkable good figure for a small farm sale. Mr. Eckardt intends to go into the threshing business in real earnest from now on since he will be relieved from doing farm work. Messrs. Jacob Grove and J.A.M. 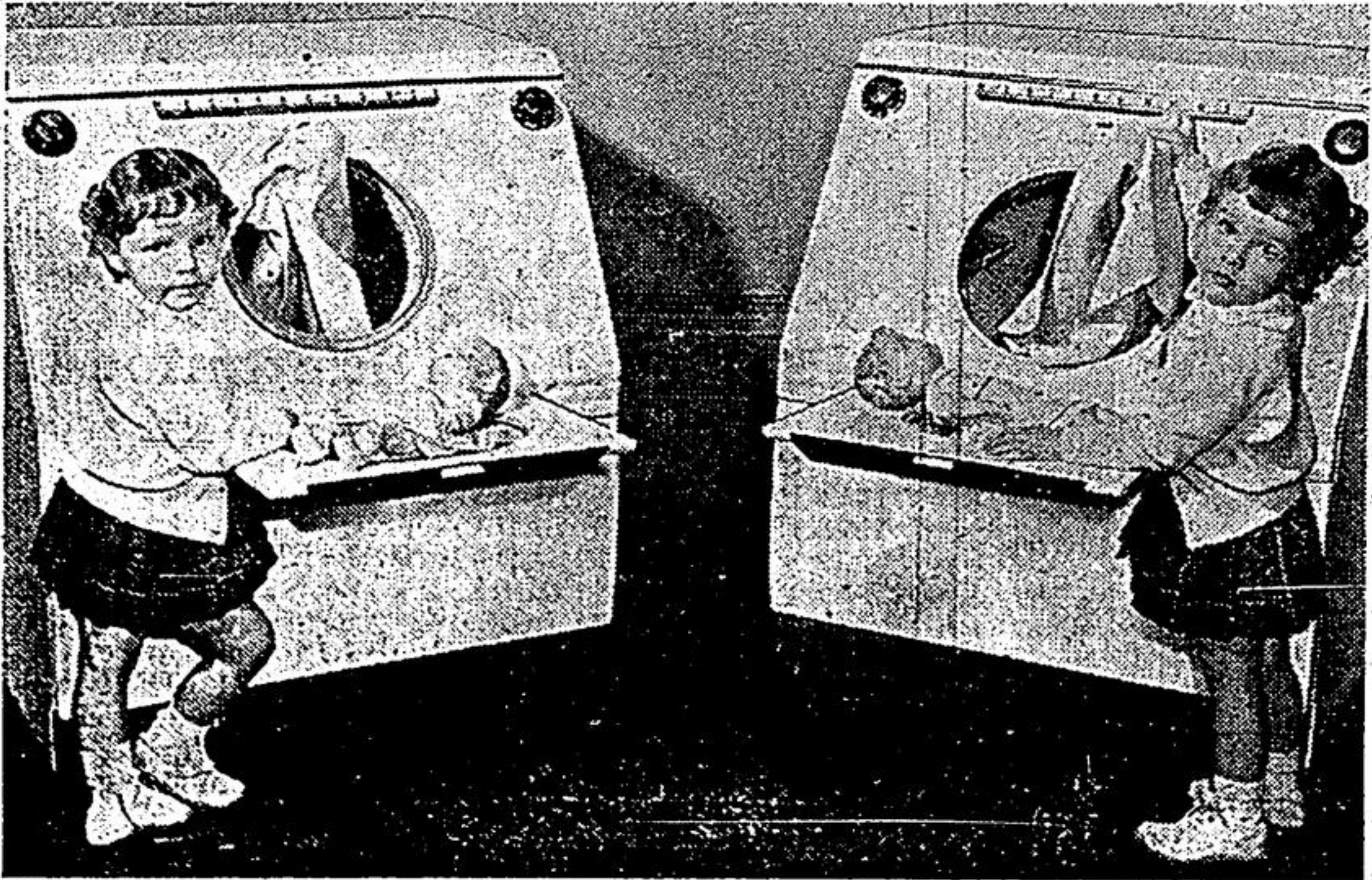
