Parasite on N. York Oats

Many fields of oats throughout North York are showing yellowish patches this year, according to Agricultural Representative W.M. Cockburn. Up to the present, much damage has been caused by a very minute eel-like worm.

The Agricultural Representative warns that infested fields should not be sown with oats again for a number of years. He explains that the affected oat crops will show a bronze discoloration on the tips of the leaves if the nematode is at work.

For the current year, Mr. Cockburn urges the full use of commercial fertilizers to stimulate rapid growth enabling the plants to partially overcome the effects of the parasite.
