Ontario County Council has Be Hospital Provincial Dept. of Hgys. to issue debentures up to \$100,-600 for the construction of new pavement in the county. special meeting of the Council is being held today to decide where the paving will be laid. If the 25 miles are complet

ed, the county's paved road mileage will be increased per cent County Road Superintendent, R.E. Sims said yesterday. Further, it will represent the largest road construction undertaken in the County since it was organized.

The decision of the Depart ment of Highways, which cu the county's road budget fo this year substantially, thus ruling out any possibility new paving, is big news, and will no doubt, be well received by the county legislators.

The Council has long fe year is in the long run the most economical, but the lack of funds has been a stumbling block. The traffic on county roads today is greater than it ever was, and roads will have to be constructed to take care of it.

Ontario Act Amended To Aid Retarded

The Ontario Education Dept. will subsidize the education of retarded children to the extent of \$250 a pupil annually under an amendment to the Education Act published last week.

The grant will be paid to parent groups on the basis of average daily attendance for each month in which classes operate. The Ontario Association for Retarded Children is responsible for statements. to the deputy minister giving full statistics.

Children up to 18 years of age, incapable of development beyond the mentality of a child of eight, must be admitted free of charge.

Amend Bylaw Allow Estate

Municipal The Ontario Board Thursday approved an amendment to the Langstaff-Thornhill zoning bylaw in Markham Twp., to permit erection of a private hospital on the estate of the late George McCullagh, former publisher of The Telegram and Globe Machine; Machineless, Cold Wave and Mail.

No residents appeared at the Municipal Board hearing and Markham deputy reeve Alfred LeMasurier spoke in favour of the amendment. He pointed out the hospital would mean some \$1,600 in taxes annually, for the township.

Dr. E.E. Shouldice, who plans to build the hospital on the 135-acre estate, declined to say how much it would cost. He has not yet applied for a building permit.
