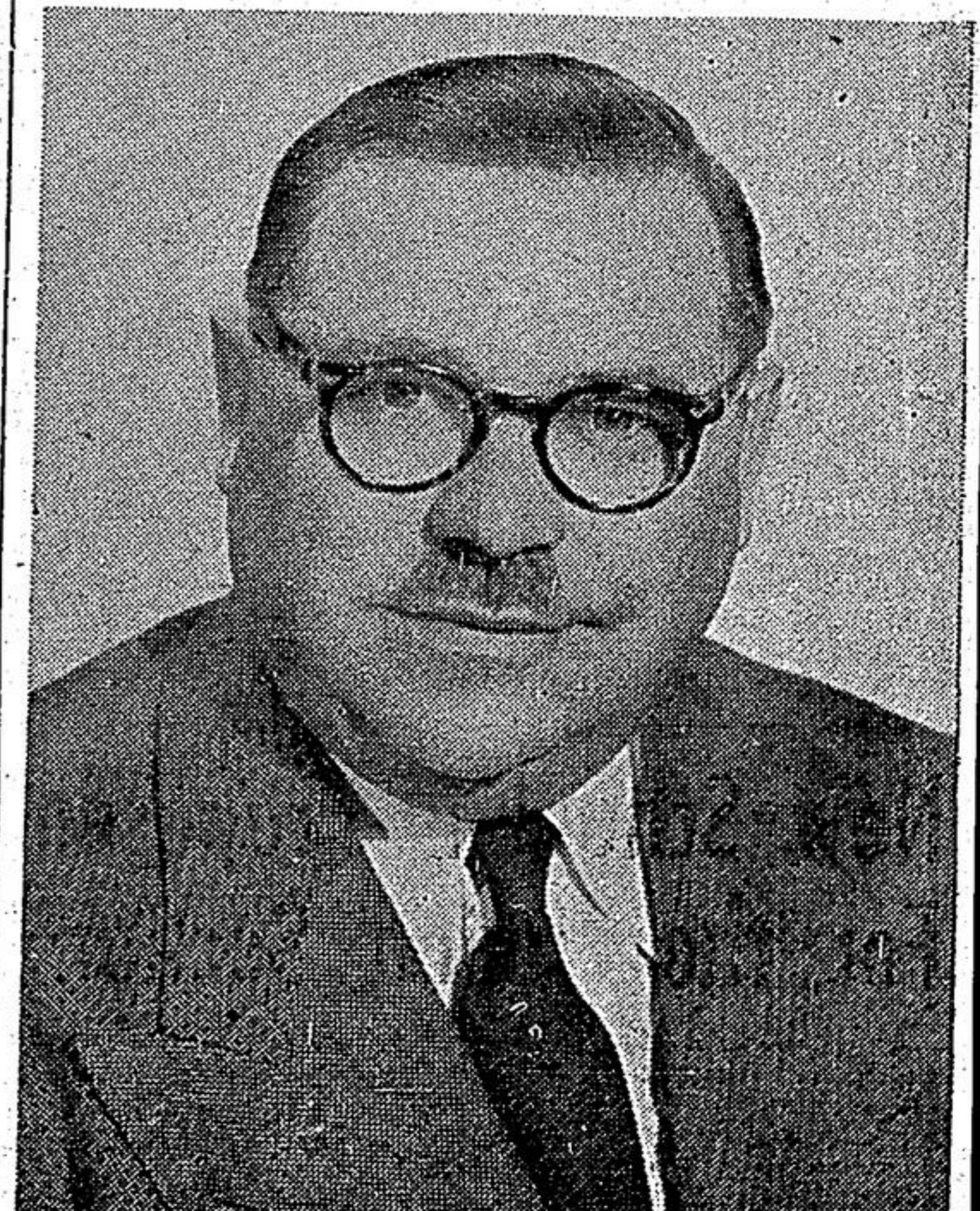
## UXBRIDGE MAN IS KILLED YOUNGER BROTHER HELD
