**Trains Hit Two Trucks, Drivers Only Bumped**

Two truck drivers escaped with only head bumps Friday, but their trucks were demolished in level-crossing accidents.

Denzil Johnston, 32, of Holland Landing, was uninjured when a CNR train struck his stake truck on the King-East Gwillimbury Township line, near Vandorf. Parts of the truck were scattered 125 feet along the tracks.

Trucker Andy Sanders also drove into the path of a speeding train and escaped with only head cuts and bruises.

Sanders, 40, said he had stopped for the warning signals at the Dundas St. and Royal York Rd. crossing when a driver on the other side of the tracks signaled him across.

"I don't even remember seeing the train," Sanders said in the Emergency Ward of St. Joseph's Hospital. "I don't remember thinking anything in particular except that if I didn't stay on my feet when I got out I would go unconscious."

His five-ton truck was crushed into a ditch on the west side of the tracks. The platform was torn from the body.

The train was the crack CPR Toronto-Chicago flyer.

**Away Working In Markham As Home Burns**

A family of seven was left homeless Tuesday after fire levelled their five-room cottage home at Humber Trails, a small community near Nobleton. A line of clothing is all they have left.

Percy Lewis, a carpenter, who built the house in his spare time, was at work in Markham Twp when the blaze swept through his dwelling. Mrs. Lewis and the children, aged 5 to 16, were in Toronto.

Aurora firemen, called to the scene by the Lewis' neighbours, arrived too late to save the home after losing their way on back roads before reaching the relatively new community.

Firemen said the blaze was caused by an overheated coal stove left burning when the family went out earlier in the day. Loss of the building and contents was estimated at \$6,000.

Neighbours have already made plans to take in the homeless family for at least two weeks or until other accommodation is arranged.

**Will Dispose of Municipal Office By Auction**

Markham Twp. council agreed at their regular meeting on Monday evening that the municipal office and garage should be disposed by auction in the fall. The various departments expect to move into their new municipal offices at Buttonville later in the year.

A heated discussion arose between Dep. Reeve LeMasurier and councillor Chas. Hooper with regard to the spending of receipts obtained from the sale. Dep. Reeve LeMasurier contended that the public were promised that the sale receipts would be used as partial payment on the debenture debt while councillor Hooper suggested that the money be used for extra expenses in and around the new structure.
