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Township of Whitchurch

By-law number 1404

A BY-LAW FOR PRESCRIBING TIMES FOR SETTING FIRES AND PRECAUTIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

WHEREAS the Municipality is empowered to pass a by-law to prescribe the times during which fires may be set in the open air and the precautions to be observed by persons setting off fires.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable by the Council of the Township of Whitchurch to prescribe such times and precautions.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WHITCHURCH AS FOLLOWS:

- No person shall set a fire in the open air in the Township of Whitchurch after the hour of 9 P.M. in any day and before the hour of 6 A.M. in any day.
- No person shall set a fire in the Township of Whitchurch in the open air for burning grass until he has first notified the Chief Constable of the Township of Whitchurch of his intention so to do, stating in such notification the following:
 - The day and hour when the fire is to be set out.
 - The place where the fire is to be set out.
 - The name of at least one adult other than the applicant who will be in attendance until the fire has been completely extinguished.
 - The means of extinguishing the fire.
- No person shall set a fire in the open air in the Township of Whitchurch unless and until he shall have present at the place of setting out the said fire at least one other adult person named in the notification to the Chief Constable, as aforesaid, prepared to remain at the scene of the fire until the same has been extinguished and prepared to extinguish the fire when and after required to do so.
- No person shall set a fire in the open air in the Township of Whitchurch unless and until he shall have present at the place where the fire is to be set out an amount of water, chemical fire extinguisher or equipment or other fire fighting equipment suitable for the extinguishing of such fire.
- No person shall set a fire in the open air in the Township of Whitchurch save in accordance with each of the terms of the application or notification to the Chief Constable, as aforesaid.
- No person shall set out a fire in the open air in the Township of Whitchurch without remaining in attendance immediately at the site of the fire until the fire has been completely extinguished.
- No person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall forfeit and pay at the discretion of the convicting magistrate a penalty not exceeding the sum of \$50.00 for each offence, exclusive of costs.

PASSED in open Council this 28th day of May, 1953.
