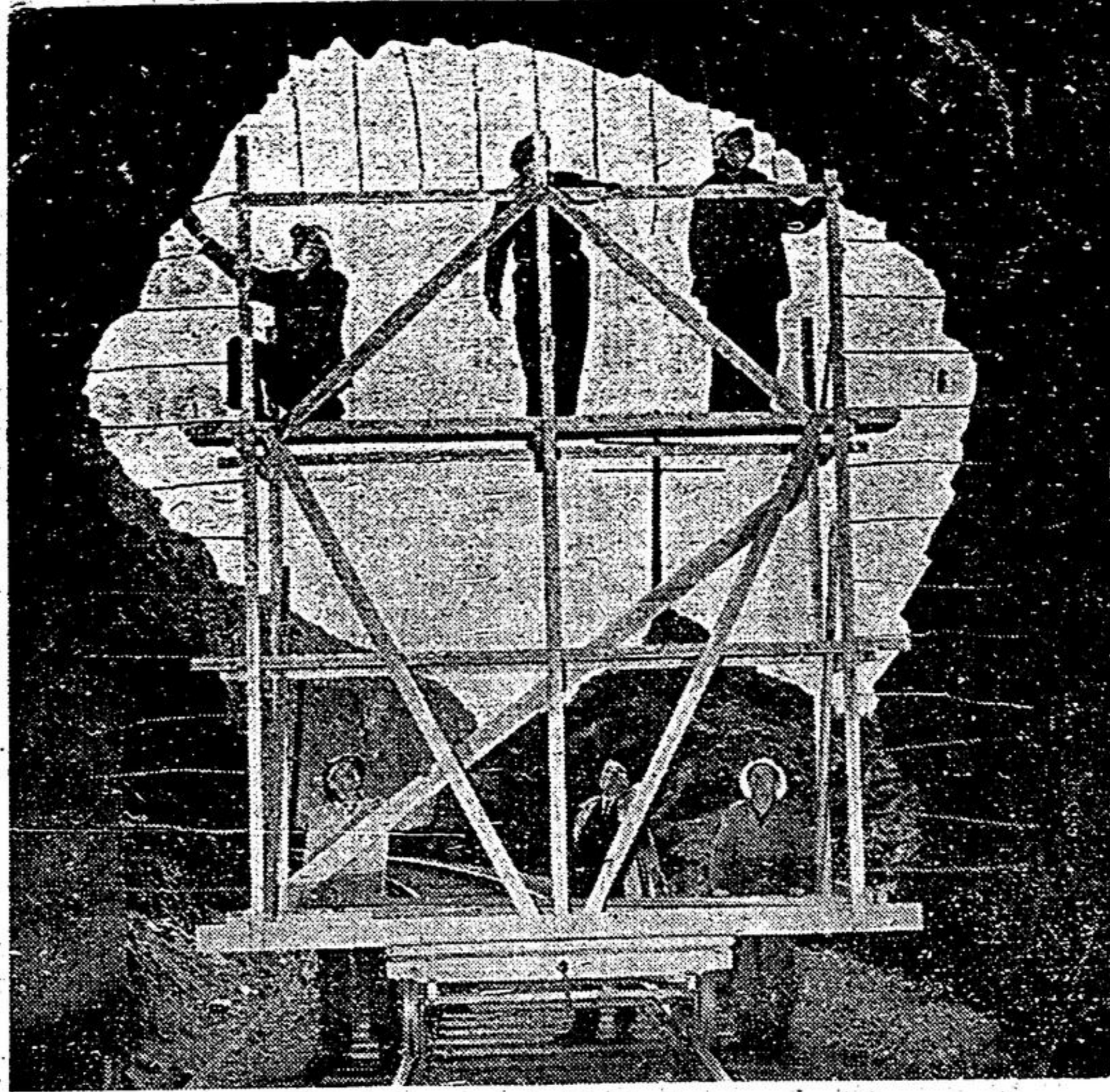
Mrs. D. Harrington and daughter, Miss Grace Harrington called on friends in the village on Sunday.
