
Brightest Lights

Workmen are installing the last few lights of an \$11,000 street lighting project which, when completed next will give-Aurora one of most brightly lighted main thoroughfares of any town in the country.

The lights, which are replacing old style lamps on wooden poles will light the street for a distance of two miles: They will be mounted on steel poles set close to the buildings and will be carried over the middle of the road on extension arms.

The lights are of the mercury vapor type and give a steady blue-white illumination. They have been installed the north and south ends of town and only a short section in the business district remains to be serviced.




