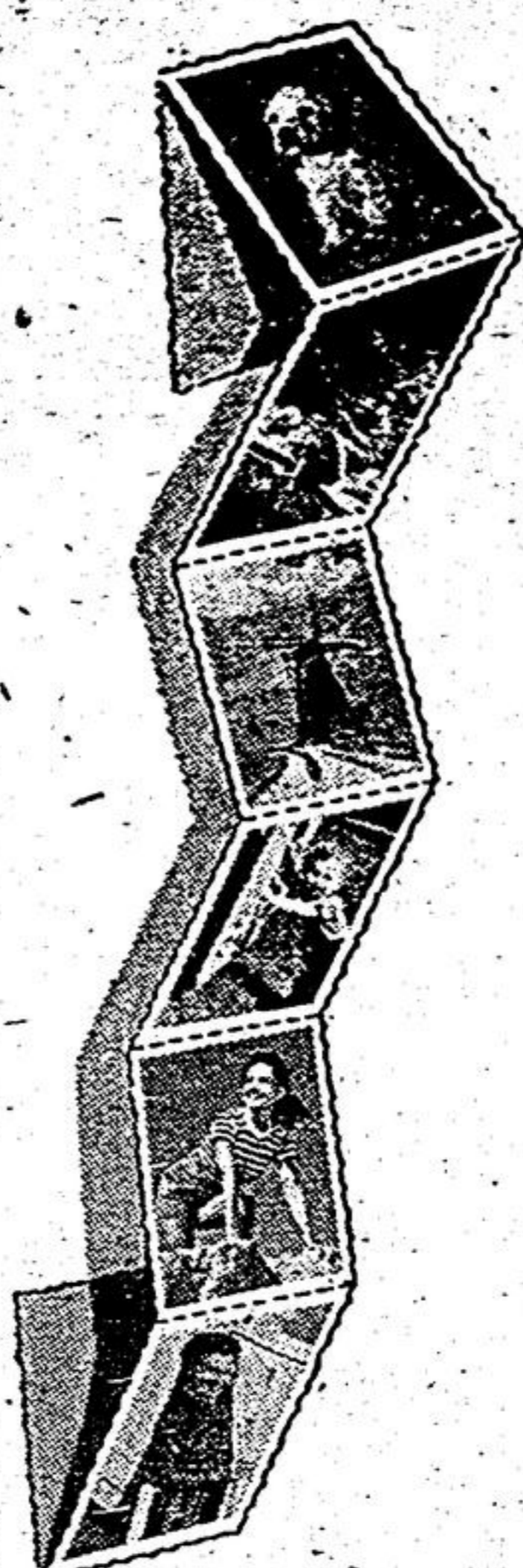

No Hint How Much MP's Pay Will Rise

Though the government is known to be considering pay increases in the Commons, members gathering for the new session got no official clue to how much they will get for their four year term.

The speech from the throne read at the opening of Parliament did not mention members' sessional indemnities. However, informants said the question is under study by government experts and that legislation to increase the indemnities is fairly certain to be brought in some time during the current session.

The timing of the legislation these sources said, will depend largely on when the government agrees on the type of increases to be given.

At present, all Commons members receive \$6,000 a year, of which \$2,000 is tax-exempt. Parliamentary assistants to ministers get another \$4,000. Ministers get \$18,000 altogether and the prime minister receives \$23,000. The prime minister also lives in a government residence but he pays back \$5,000 a year for this.

Several ways to increase the basic indemnity are under consideration:

1. Adding \$3,000 which would put it up to \$9,000 and retaining the existing tax-free \$2,000 in this total.
2. Paying a straight \$10,000, all of which would be taxable.
3. Boosting the total to \$10,

Ferr said he paid \$20 for the "nice little wagon" at a sale, but that it would cost \$50 to repair. He said only the wheels are left. Timms admitted towing the wagon behind his car to the lake about five miles away.

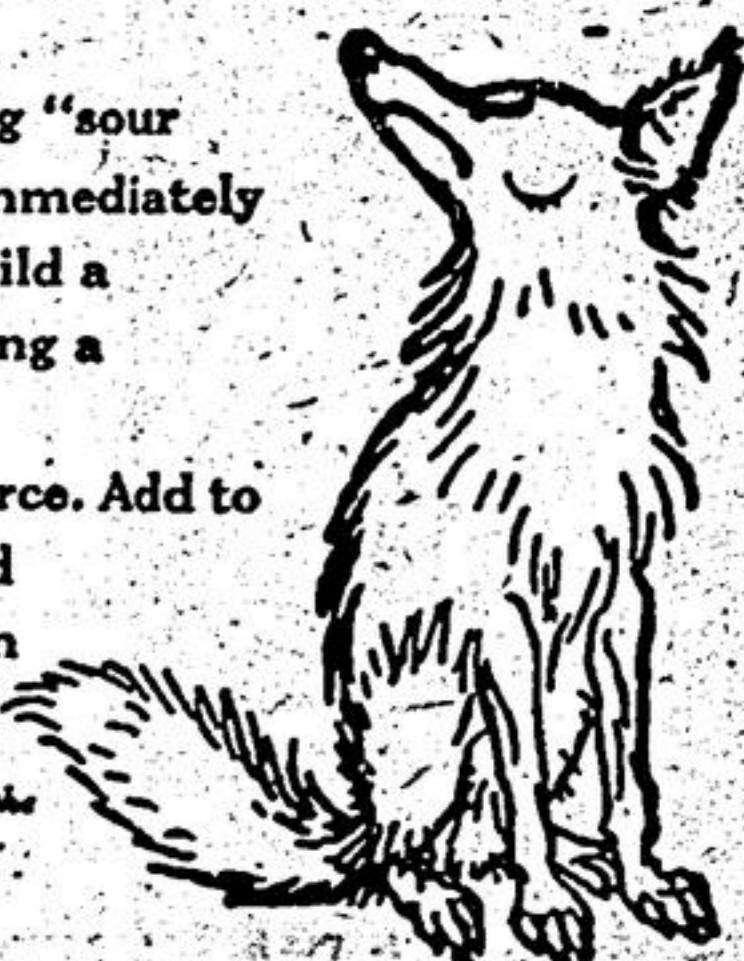


The Fox and The Grapes
