## Potato Course At Guelph

At the request of the Potato section, Ontario Soil and Crop Improvement Association, a short course on the subject of potatoes is being organized this year for the first time, at the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph. Dates are December 28th to December 31st, inclusive. Registration is limited to 35, and applications should be made at once (not later than Dec. 15th) to County and District Agricultural

### Representatives.

The course is planned to deal with both production and marketing and will include such topics as soils, cultural practices, fertility, quality, cost of production, grades and grading, packaging and merchandising storage. In so far as time will permit, arrangements will be made to inspect commercial storage and packing plants, the O.A.C. Potato Farm and quality testing laboratory.

The cost of room and board for the week will be \$10.00 and those accepted for the course will be entitled to special railway rates.

## New Monarch Cars on Display

Monarch passenger cars will introduce more major new features in 1954 than in any year since the post-war models were presented in 1948.

In addition to numerous styling refinements, the '54 models to be shown for the first time in Ford-Monarch dealer showrooms on Dec. 16, will have a completely new overhead valve, V8 engine developing 161 horsepower.

A new, high degree of stability on curves and rough roads is achieved through the incorporation of a "ball joint" front suspension which has been designed to maintain weight distribution at approximately the same point under severe driving conditions.

In addition to the regular Monarch Customline, Ford of Canada announces a completely new range of Monarch "luxury" automobiles to be known as the Lucerne series. One of the four models in this series is the Lucerne Sun Valley, which achieves much of the visibility of open cars by the use of green-tinted, solid plexiglass in the forward half of the roof. It is described as the first of its kind in the mass production automobile field.

The Lucerne series, designed for the motorist who prefers to buy a distinctive, fully-equipped car incorporates such features as power brakes, power steering, four-way power seat, tinted glass, radio, heater, and, in the case of the convertible, power window controls.

**FARMERS TESTING SOIL**  
 The open fall has enabled a larger number of farmers than usual to take soil samples to be forwarded to the Soils Department of the Ontario Agricultural College for analysis, according to Agricultural Representative W.M. Cockburn of Newmarket, whose office carries a supply of soil boxes and instruction sheets for this purpose. With the results of these tests in farmers' hands early in the winter, they have a better idea of what mixture of fertilizer to order for spring.
