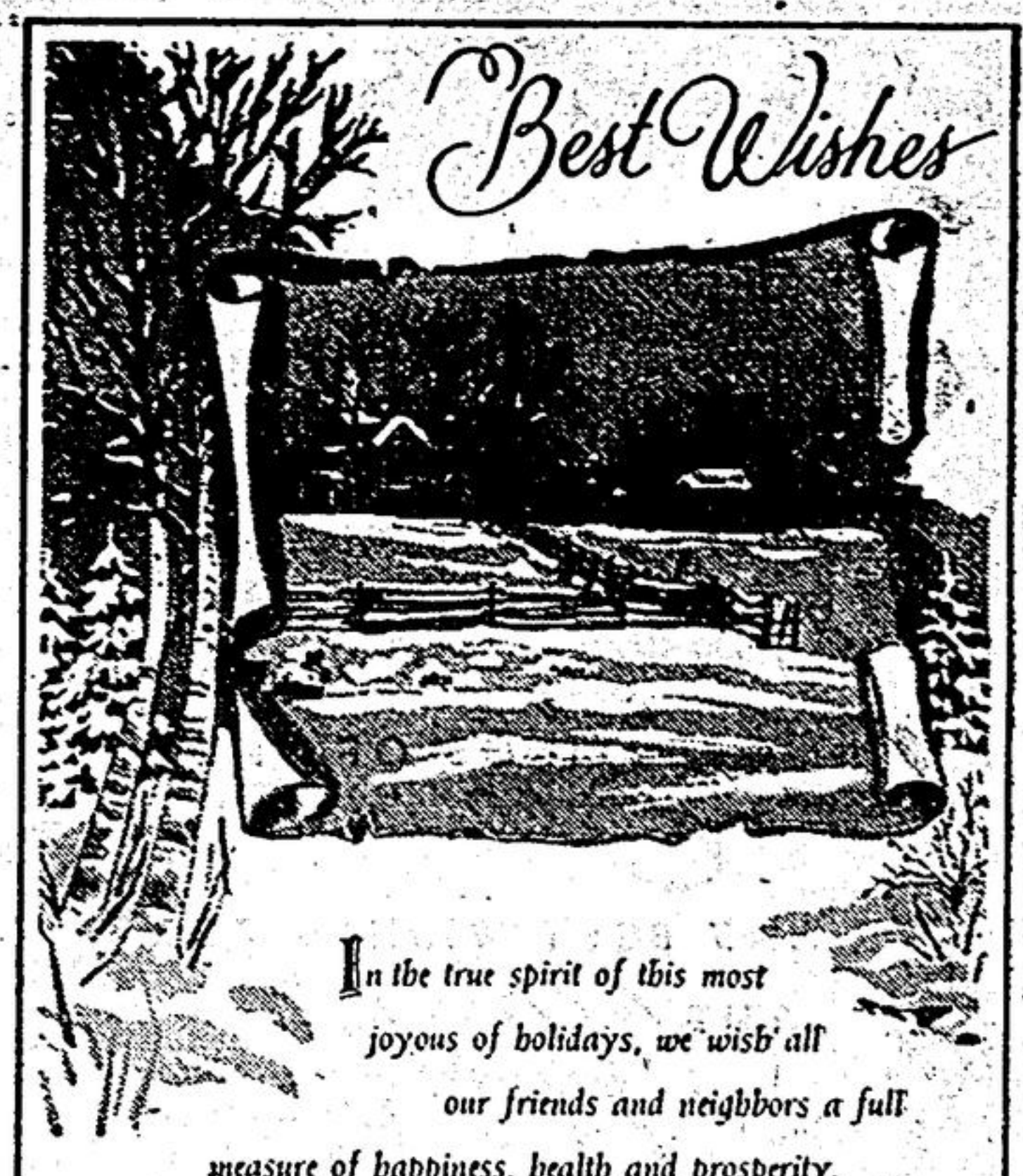
(Thursday, December 17, 1953)

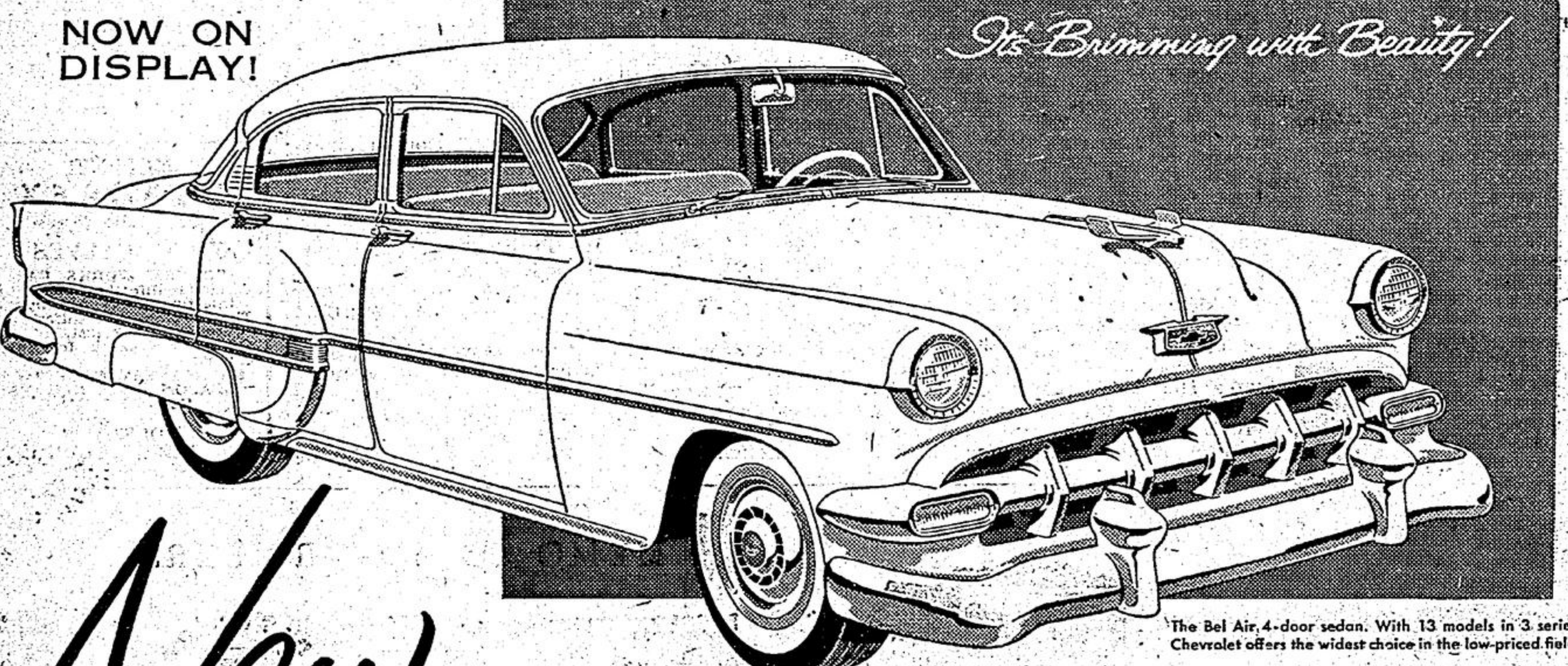
Keep in mind the Sunday School Concert this coming Friday evening, December 18. Santa will be there to meet you.
