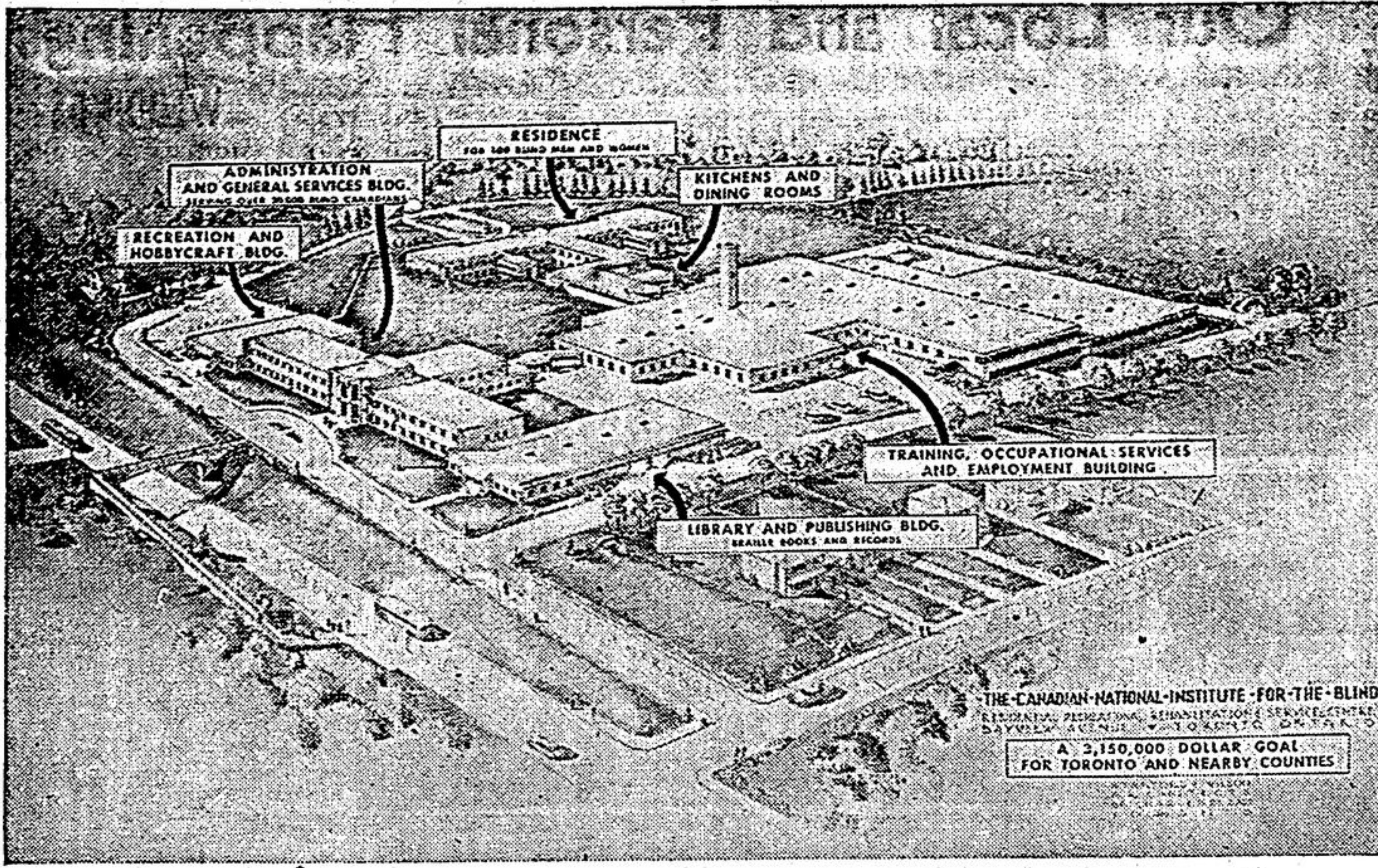


AERIAL VIEW OF PROPOSED NEW REHABILITATION CENTRE FOR BLIND
