lets in the Wilcox Lake area. Councillor McCarron stated that he objected to such a by-law until the residents there were in a position to adhere to the law with the completion of the drainage projects being carried out there. However, the reeve suggested that the bylaw could be prepared and final reading could be delayed until these drainage schemes were completed. Reeve McLaughlin placed before council the report of the Special County Committee set up for the division of Assets between the northern municipalities and the Metropolitan Area, for their perusal. Fire insurance on township buildings were insured with some increases as follows: township office and contents, \$20,000; community hall and contents \$10,000; grader shed \$2,000; implement shed \$2,500; open shed \$500; weed sprayer \$82.00. Council agreed to the annual bank borrowing bylaw for the amount of \$125,000, the same amount as in 1952. Road Supt. Davis told council that there was some dissatisfaction concerning wages among the road employees and that the men would appear before council at the next meeting.

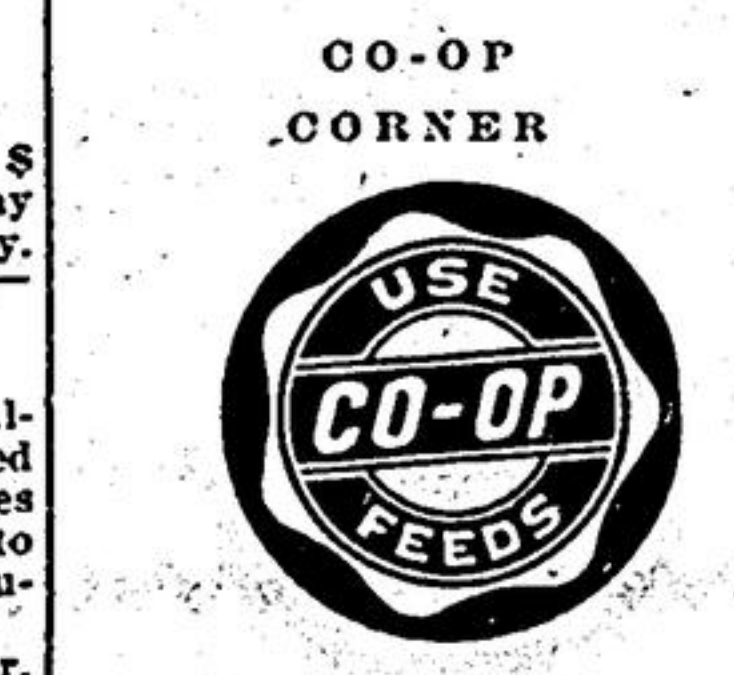
