## Pickering H.S. Host to Principals

Deputy reeve Kenneth Lee of the Town of Whitby, and Reeve Rae, Ferguson of the town of Uxbridge, were elected to the Board of Managers of the Fairview Lodge. They will sit with an Oshawa representative, Warden Garnet Wilson and Mayor Naylor, of Oshawa, the latter being ex-officio members of the committee.

Vice-Chairman John Mills, of the Improvement District of Ajax, was named to the Board of audit for Criminal Justice accounts in the county.
