Verse 8 — "All that ever came before me are thieves and robbers. . ." A very difficult verse. It cannot mean that Moses and the prophets including John the Baptist were thieves and robbers. The reference must again be to the Pharisees who had wrested the teaching office and were leading the people away from a spiritual religion to one of formalism. But the "sheep" had been guarded from going after them.

Vrese 9 - " am the door . . he shall be saved and shall go in and out and find pasture." To be eligible you must be 17 to 40 years of age, Now more implicitly He speaks of Himself as the one and only way of salvation. See 14:6 and Acts 4:12.

> Verse 10 - "... I am come that they might have life . . . more abundantly."
