**Sunday School Workers Convene**

The Sunday School Workers' conference was opened in the Stouffville United Church by a short worship service conducted by the convener, Rev. Butt of Unionville. A roll call indicated about sixty present representing Agincourt, Box Grove, Cherrywood, Epson, Goodwood, Locust Hill, Markham, Melville, Siloam, Unionville, Stouffville, Uxbridge, Victoria Square, Whitevale and Zion.

Mr. Butt explained that the purpose of the meeting was to enable workers to receive mutual help to their common problems and suggested that this might well be the first of a series of regular conferences.

A film entitled "For Every Child" was shown to the whole groups in the church parlors. The meeting was then divided into five discussion groups which met separately to discuss matters of special interest to them. There were as follows: Nursery and Beginners, under Miss MacIvride; Primary, under Miss Hosie; Juniors, under Mr. Asling; Intermediate and Senior, under Mrs. Russell and Superintendents, under Mr. Comfort.

The reports from these groups were enthusiastically received and indicated that much inspiration and practical help had been obtained.

In the period set aside for election of officers, it was decided to delegate the responsibility of carrying on this work to a committee comprised of the Superintendents of all the Sunday Schools represented. Mr. Comfort of Markham was appointed as the convener of this committee.

In the concluding address, Rev. Mathers called on the workers to remember that Christian education must be Christ-centered and to re-dedicate themselves to God's work having a real sense of His continued presence and a clear sense of devotion and humility.

**Pleads Not Guilty To Driving Charge**

Kazmier Stankiewicz pleaded not guilty to a charge of driving without a license when an accident at Locust Hill was investigated by the Ontario Provincial Police on January 24th.
