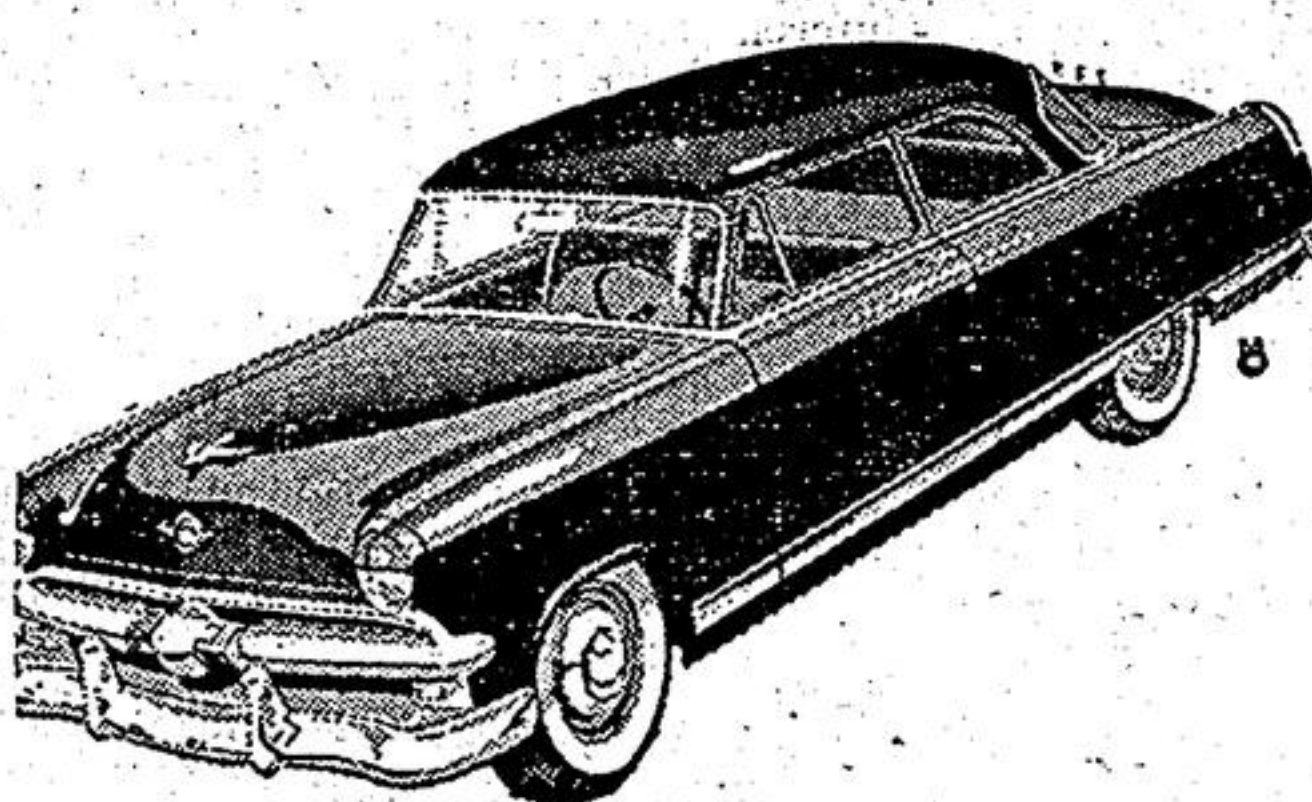
Mrs. Gunn of Winnipeg was a guest at the home of Rev. and Mrs. Moore last week.
