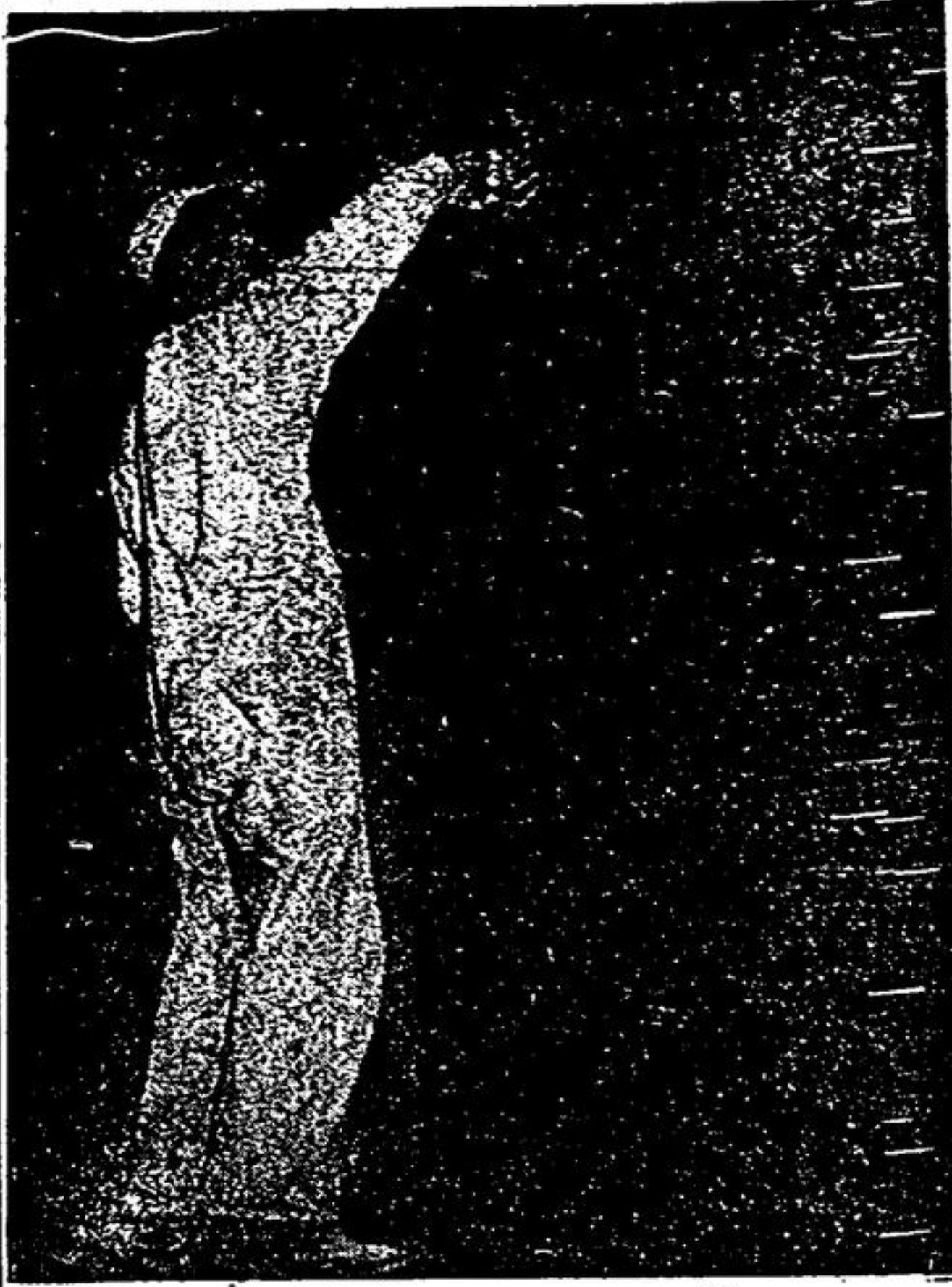

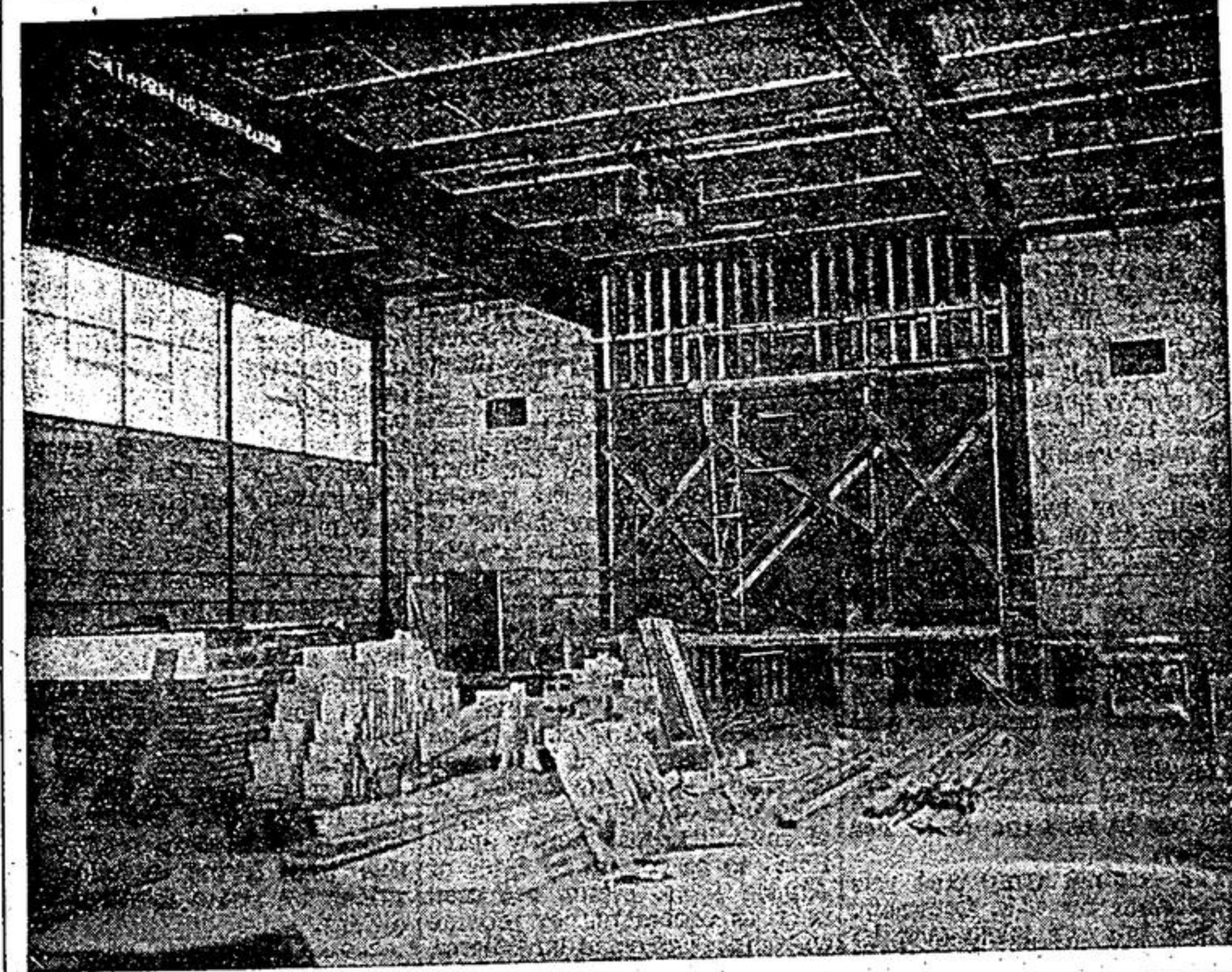

Italian Marble, Tiled Walls In New High School



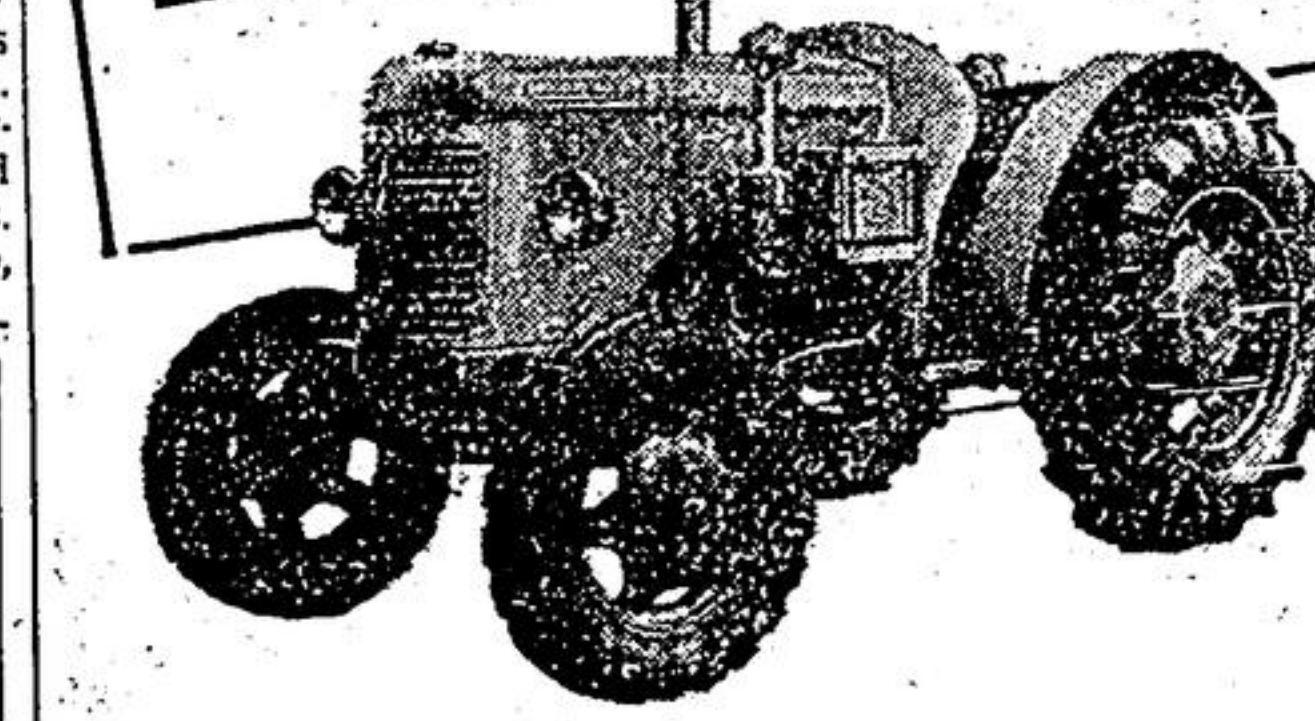
There are girl's showers all in Italian white marble and spacious boy's showers and wash-rooms in beautiful tiling of an egg-shell hue, in the new Stouffville District High school. The accommodations are a far cry from father's or grandfather's day and certainly offer every facility to the growing youth of this locality.
While work is proceeding with all speed under the Brown Construction Co., workmen who recently took over the job, much remains to be done before school opens next September.
Plastering is one of the big jobs at present and one of the workmen was caught here by the Tribune camera as he put the rough coat on the drop wall in the main hallway below which will fit dozens and dozens of steel lockers. Gyproc lath has been applied to the ceilings and sound board will follow in the hallways.
Also seen here is a look at the gymnasium, auditorium with its high ceiling and massive steel supporting beams. Also seen is scaffolding placed in erecting the stage. The new heating units are on the ceiling. The auditorium will accommodate five hundred persons and seating for this number has been purchased in new nesting chairs which can be readily stored below the stage.

3rd VICTORY LOAN BONDS have been CALLED FOR PAYMENT JUNE 1st

IF YOU HOLD Third Victory Loan 3% Bonds (issued November, 1942 to mature November, 1956) they should be presented for payment on or after June 1st through any branch bank in Canada. AFTER THIS DATE NO FURTHER INTEREST WILL BE PAID. The interest coupon dated November 1st, 1954, and all coupons dated later than this must be attached to the bonds when they are presented for payment. Payment will be \$101.26 for a \$100 bond (and for other denominations accordingly). This payment includes a \$1 premium as required by the terms of the bond—plus 26c which is interest at 3% from May 1st to June 1st—the period since the last coupon became payable.
