Evidence was that in September of 1952, Mrs. Gordon had given the defendant \$960 in cash, an amount which was to pay for one year's board and lodging at the Beach home for one year at the rate of \$80 per month. Further evidence was that Mrs. Gordon, who, it was stated, had a great fear of being committed to the county home, had converted her assets to cash and had given the defendant \$5,161, her total assets.

His Lordship ruled that the deceased was either mentally impaired or undue pressure had been exerted upon her to make such agreements with the defendants, as, he stated, no rational person would turn their assets over to another and thereby lose all bargaining powers. He then ruled that they should pay the plaintiffs \$5,973 10 a.m.-Church Bible School plus court costs.
