**Find Driver Not Negligent**

An Ontario County jury has found that an Oshawa driver was not negligent in an accident in which his car veered across the street into the path of an oncoming car. In the civil action before Judge John E. Pritchard, Carl Swartz, R.R. 3 Uxbridge, was suing Jack King and his father, Frederick King, of 220 Nassau Street, Oshawa, for damages which resulted when King's car shot across Simcoe Street and collided almost head-on with Swartz's car. The jury, in a verdict given in Whitby Wednesday morning, found that King was not negligent. The action was dismissed against the Kings with the plaintiff, Swartz, being required to pay Court costs. A. W. S. Greer, QC. of Oshawa; appeared for the Kings and J. P. Mangin, QC. of Oshawa, appeared for the plaintiff.

In evidence taken on Wednesday, Swartz stated that he had been proceeding south on Simcoe Street N., on May 6th, 1953 when his car was suddenly struck by a northbound car driven by Jack King, 17 at that time. He was suing for damages of almost \$1,450 since his 1950 model car had been sold for salvage. King claimed that when he had applied his brakes to make a right turn off the
