**Can Shoot Deer Oct. 1**

Lands Minister Mapledoram said Monday the deer season for some parts of Ontario will be from Oct. 1 to Nov. 25. This season will apply in the area north of the northernmost east-west line of the Canadian National Railways and south of the southern boundaries of the hinterland area.

Other areas will open their seasons on succeeding weeks, with all deer hunting to end Nov. 25. The shortest seasons will be from Nov. 10 or Nov. 13 in certain eastern Ontario counties.

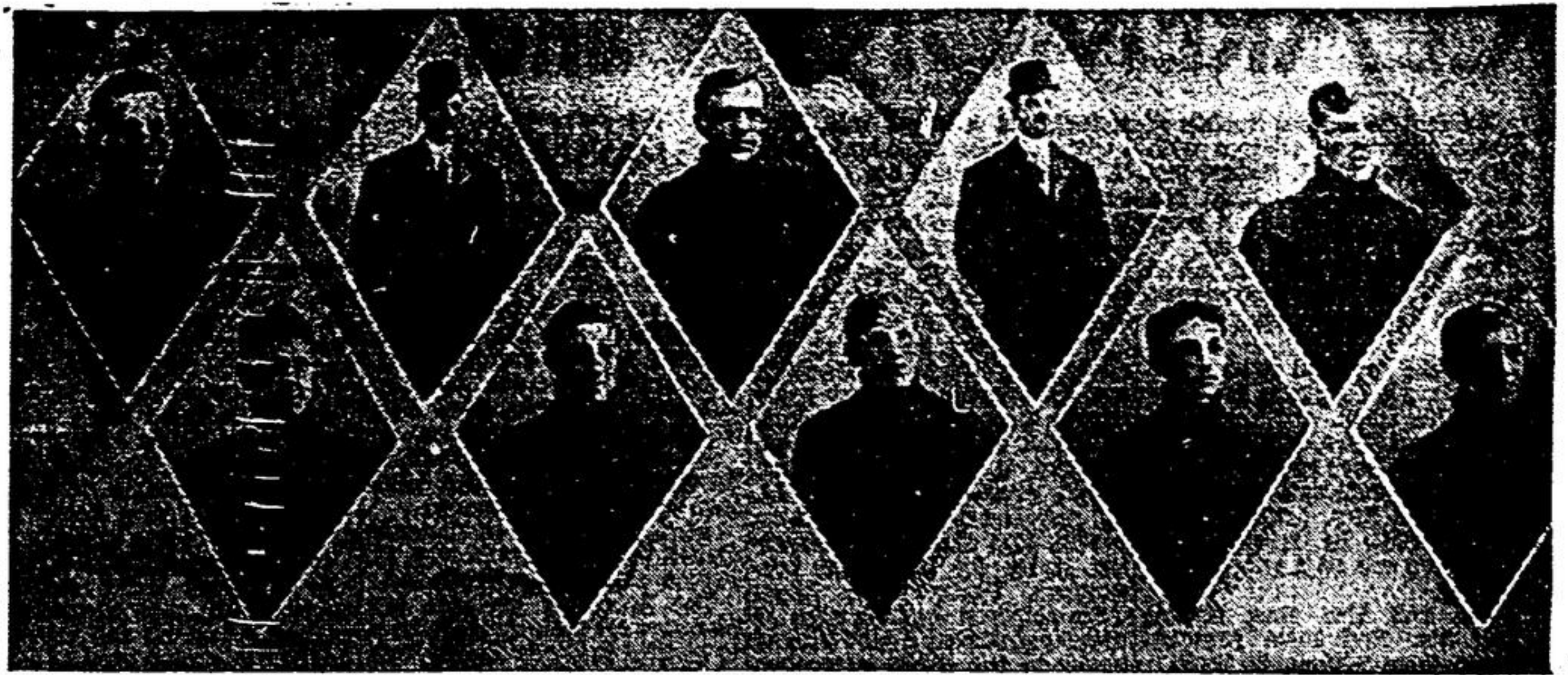
