feared that crop damage caused by hail and rain in the morning's electrical storm would run into thousands of dollars. One of the hardest hit areas was Markham Township, left without electric power from

Farmers in Markham and the north end of Pickering Township, which was pelted by hail, feared heavy damage to tomato crops and damage to a lesser extent to corn.

In Markham Township itself, tomato, corn and cabbage crops were badly damaged.

At the same time, an estimated four to five million lbs. of flue-cured tobacco was reported lost in western Ontario as the result of frost which struck early Sunday morning. Crop damage to tobacco is now estimated at over \$2,000,
