

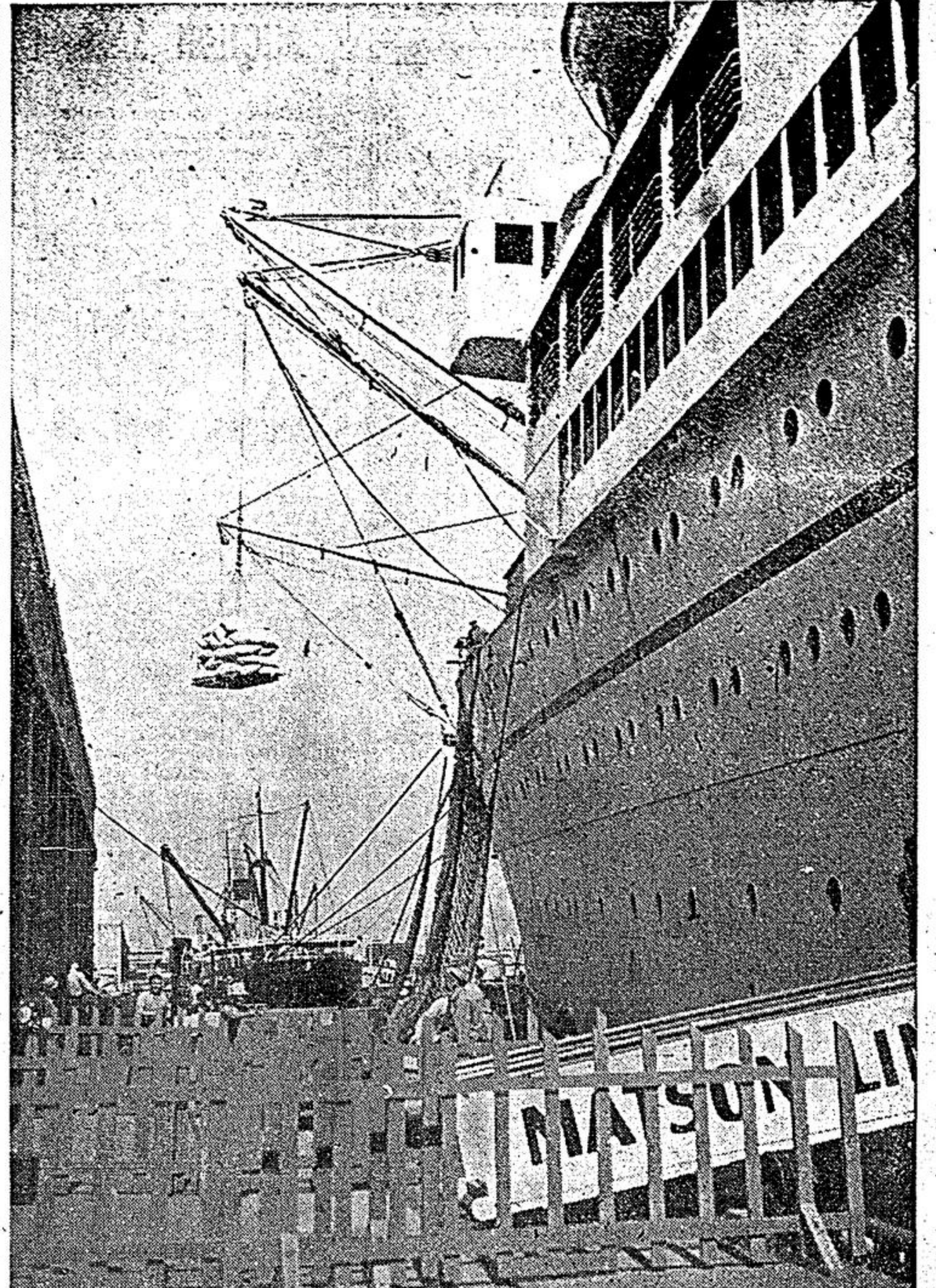

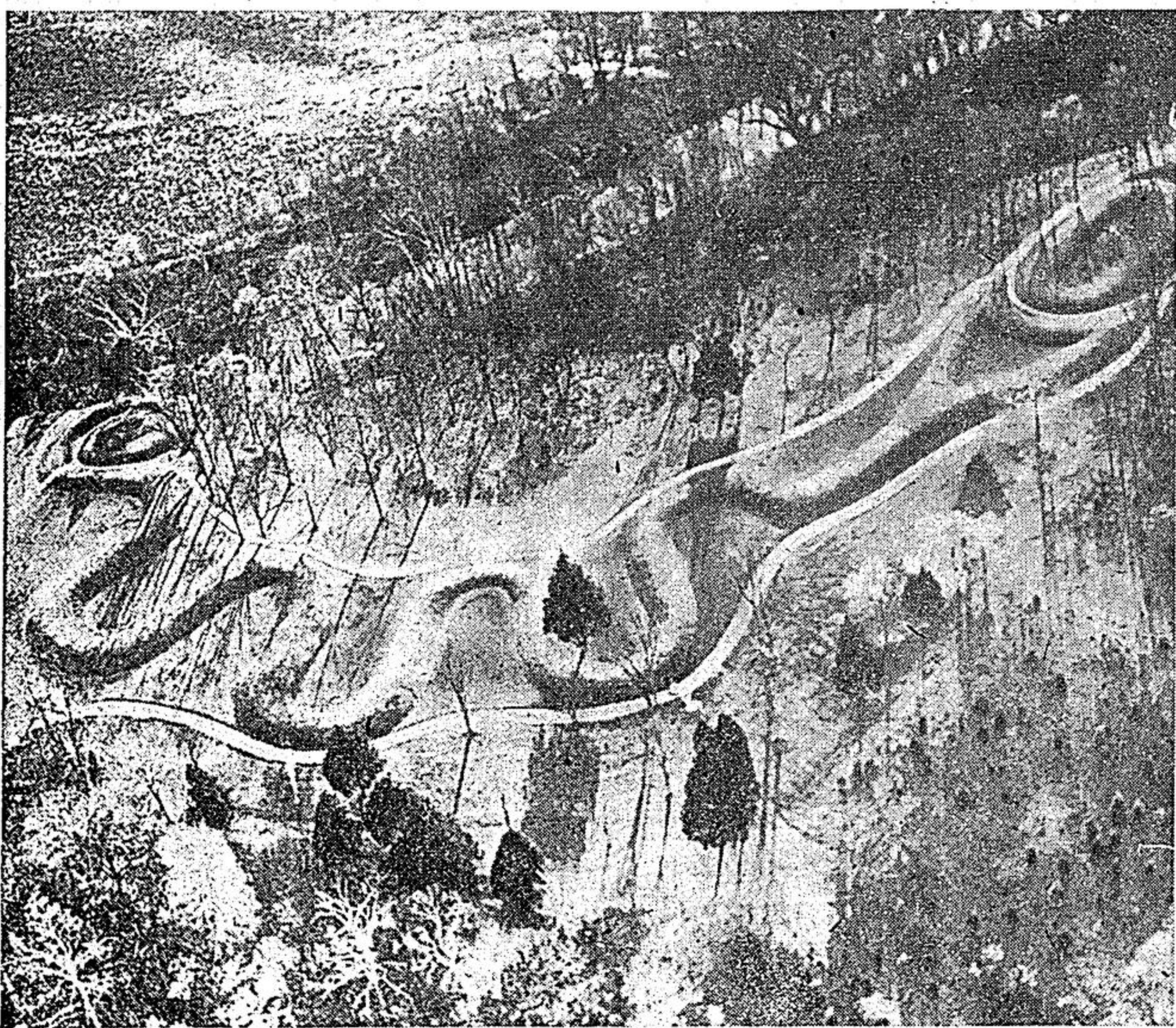

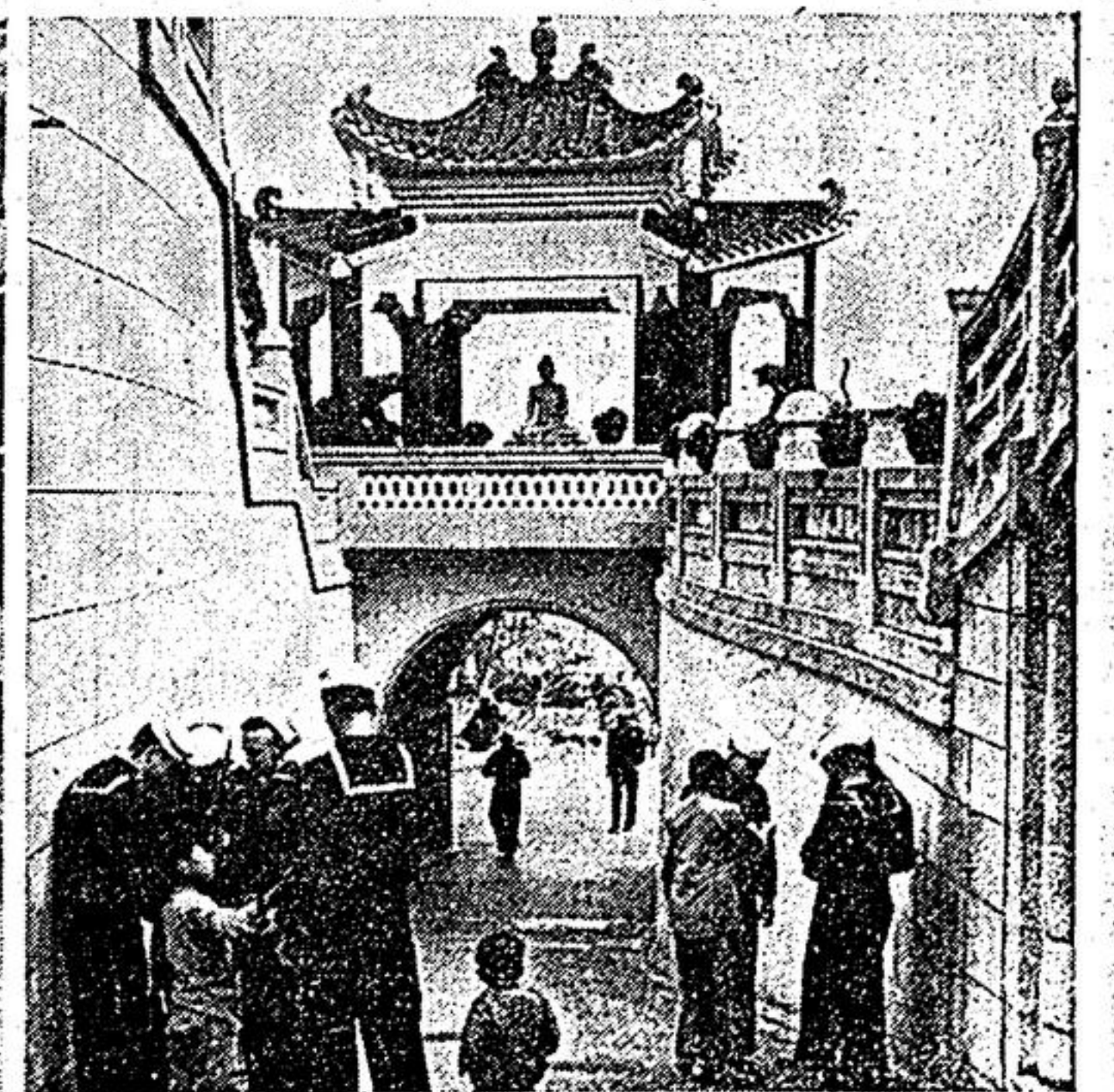
LIBERTY IN ANCIENT HONG KONG

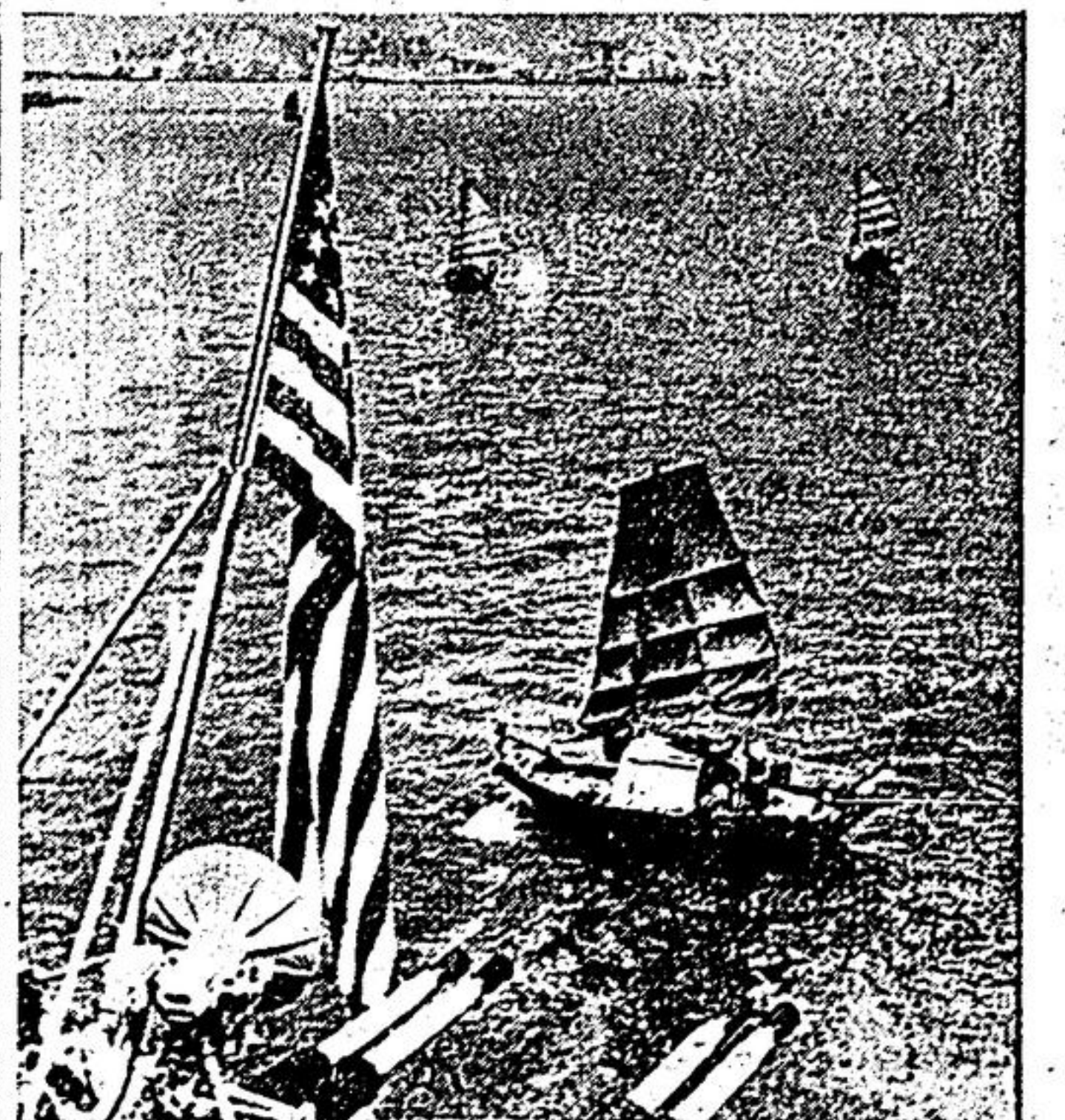
They're holding up nets to catch coins tossed over the side.
