Trustees Meet (Continued from page 6) in Ontario amounted to \$59,000,000. This year the amount will be \$62,500,000. Quite a job to distribute this huge sum fairly. "In rural areas we pay 40% of approved grant. You find 60%, said Mr. Routley, in areas with low assessment, the grant sometimes going as high as 92%. Towns and cities get the lowest grant, they have industry to share the burden.

Speaking of transportation, Mr. Routley said that in 1953, 75,000 children travelled in buses to and from school. Safety is the first and most important item here. "You must have a contract. You must have a passenger car or vehicle designed to transport passengers. That eliminates trucks. Panel trucks will do if seats and windows are provided.

The school acts have been revised and are now contained in one volume. They will be ready for distribution in the near future.
