ALGIE THEODORE THOMAS
Following a serious illness
of three weeks the death oc-
curred in the Oshawa General
Hospital on Monday, Novem-
ber 29, of Algie Theodore Tho-
mas, 41 Colborne St. W., Osh-
awa.

Born in Cardiff, Wales, on
June 25, 1894, the deceased was
a son of the late Mr. and Mrs.
Llewellyn Thomas. A resident
of Oshawa for 25 years he came
here from Campbellford.

Mr. Thomas was an employ-
ee of General Motors for 25 years
and was a member of the com-
pany's quarter century club.
He was also a member of Local
222, UAW-CIO, and served
overseas during the first world
war.

Mr. Thomas is survived by
his wife, the former Reta Ho-
over Vanzant, whom he married
in Oshawa on Oct. 8, 1927; one

The matter of a new police

what concessions could be of-
