this speck of dust, the earth! Verse 7-"a little lower than the angels; thou crownest him with glory . . . over the works of thy hands." Here is the dignity of man as ruler under God of all God's handiwork. Notice that in this passaeg the dominion of man is more extensive than in the Psalm, going beyond "all sheep and oxen."

Verse 8-". . . all things in subjection under his feet . . nothing that is not put under him." Two statements stand out in this verse: first, the universality of man's dominion under the appointment of God, and second, the fact that this dominion has not been realized. 
