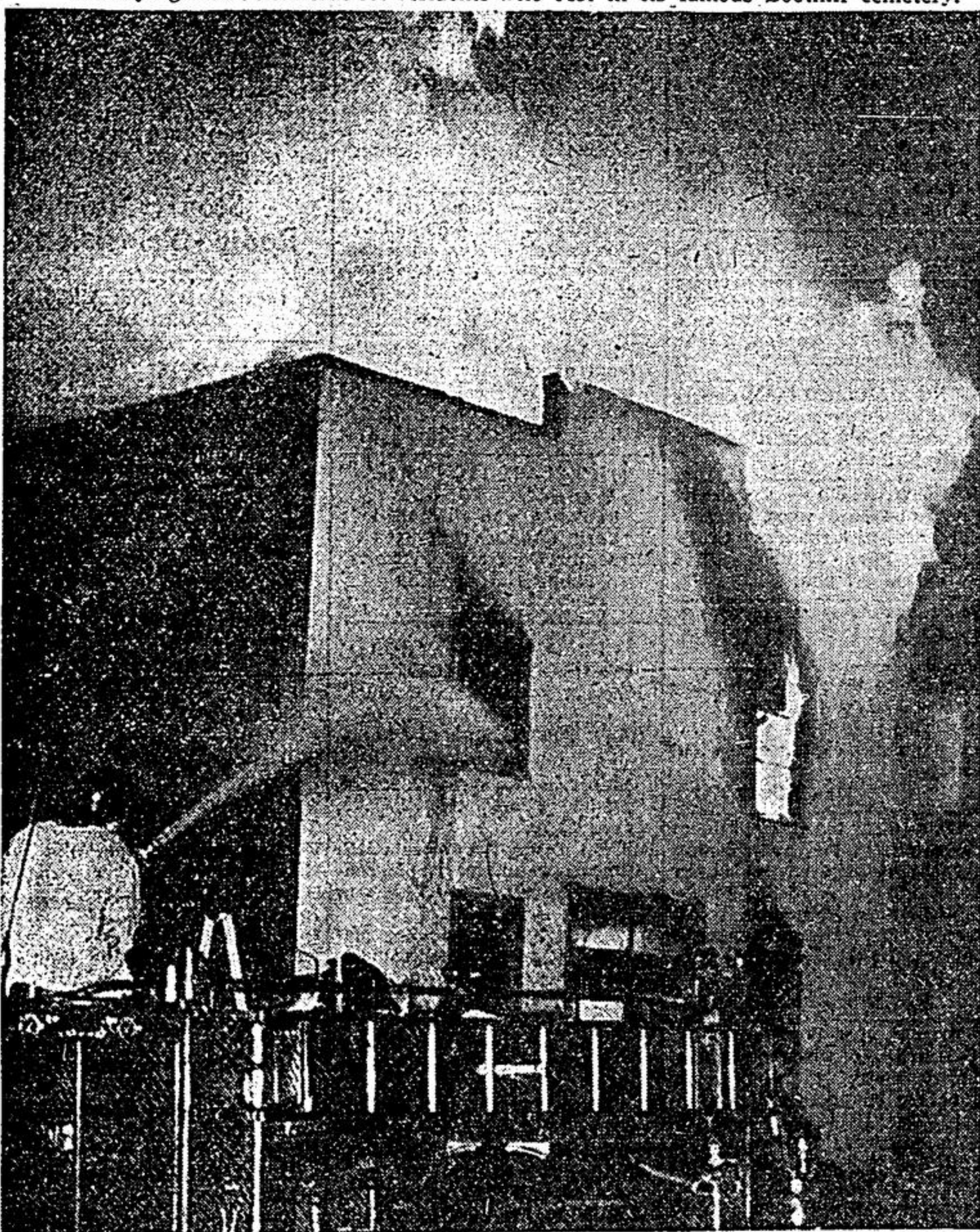

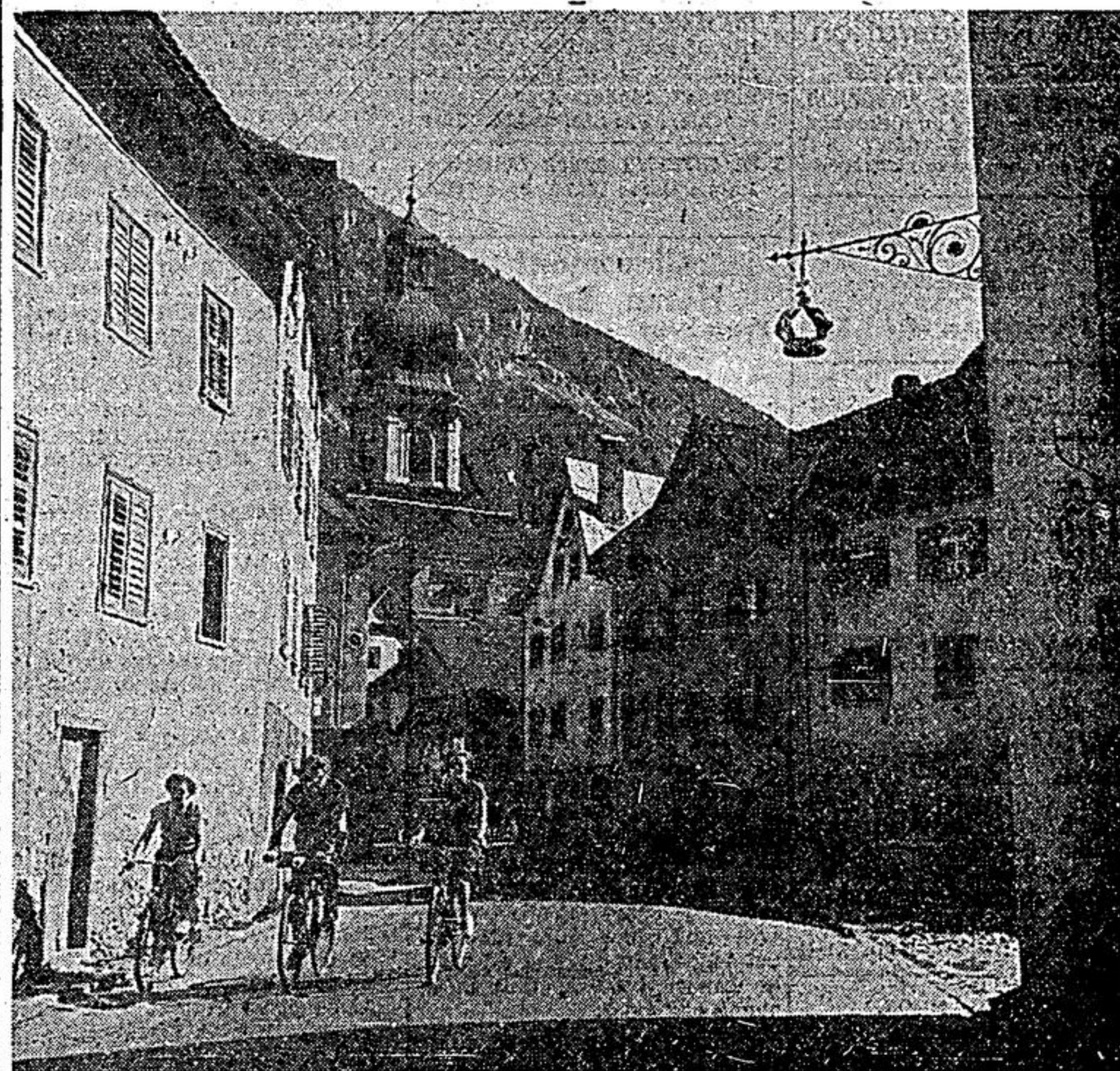

LAND OF CONTRASTS



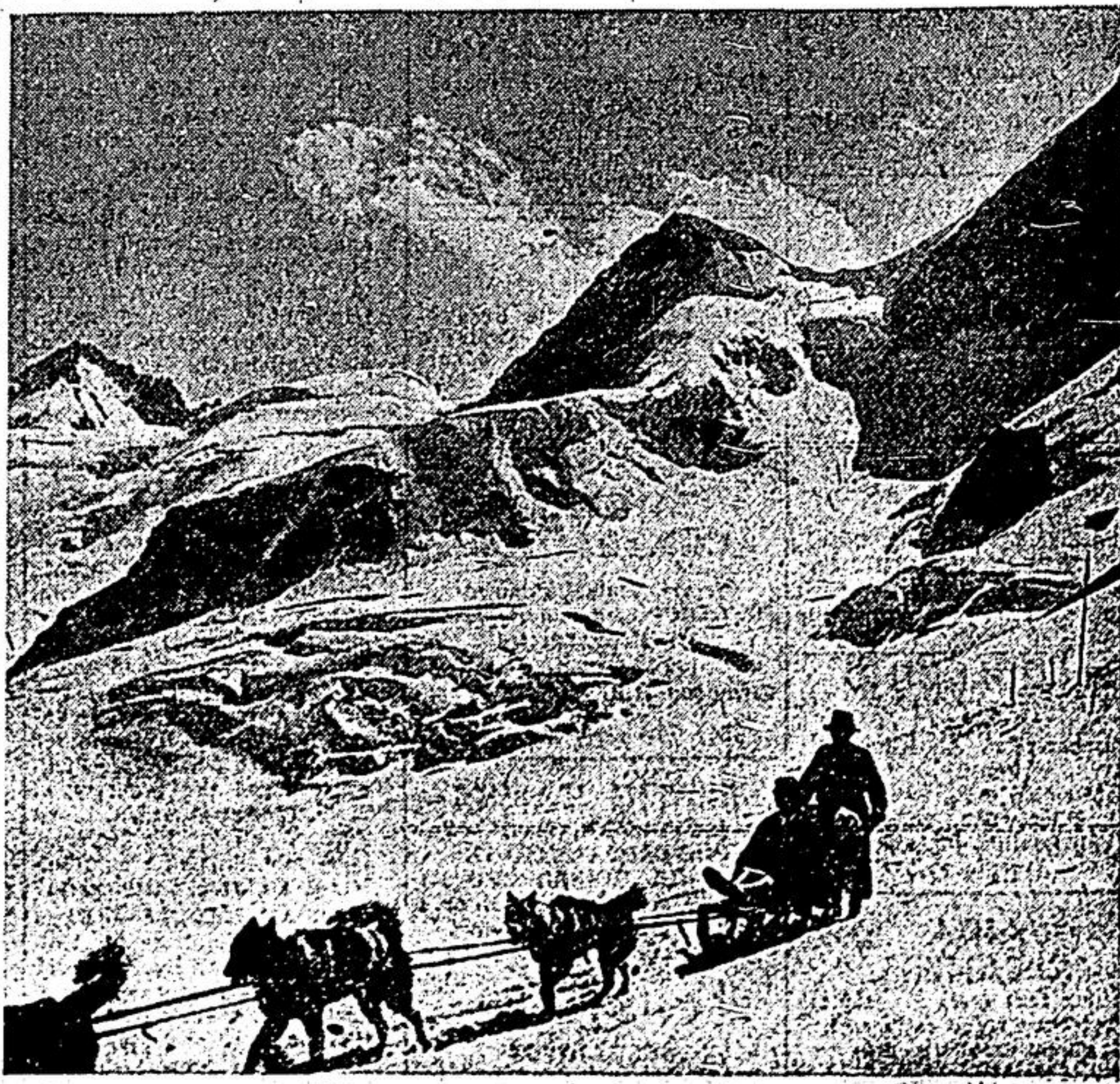
A group of cyclists pedals through the picturesque village of Domat-Ems on a four.
