GORMLEY RESIDENT PASSES AFTER LONG ILLNESS

At his home in Gormley on Sunday, July 3rd, Peter A. Brillinger passed away quietly in his 87th year. The late Mr. Brillinger had been confined to his bed following a stroke more than three years ago. He was born at Bethesda and was a farmer there for some years, later moving to Gormley where he farmed until his health failed. In 1894 he was married to Ageline Shaffer of Bethesda, who survives him. A son Roy, and seven grandchildren also survive. The late Mr. Brillinger was identified with the Heise Hill Brethren in Christ Church, where the funeral was held on the Wednesday afternoon. The service was conducted by Bishop Alvin Winger, assisted by Rev. J. R. Steckley, Rev. Roy Nigh and Rev. J. H. Heise of Fordwich. Pallbearers were Ernest Hunt, Herbert Moorby, John Smith, Edgar Steckley, Roy Wideman and Wm. Heise. Interment was in Heise Hill cemetery.



DRESSED-UP salads of fresh fruits make wonderful salad desserts and never fail to please. Why not try large black cherries in lettuce nests with pineapple spears, balls of cream cheese and black olives? Sliced roast beef placed in overlapping slices in a well seasoned tomato aspic makes a pretty special treat. Serve this with shoestring potatoes and relishes. Omelets make a nice dessert when you want a change. For example, try a puffy omelet topped with sliced peaches and sprinkled with cinnamon sugar, laced with orange marmalade. Run under the broiler just before serving. Here's a dessert that's cooling and pretty as a picture: place scoops of lime sherbet into marigold shells and serve with pineapple sauce, garnish with red berries. Rice pudding will take on seasonal glamor if you chill it in small molds then serve with a syrup of cold peaches and cherries.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK
Quick Fig-Orange Bread
(Makes 1 loaf)
1 cup dried figs
1 egg
1 1/2 cups milk
2 tablespoons oil
2 tablespoons grated orange peel
3 cups sifted all-purpose flour
1/2 cup sugar
4 teaspoons baking powder
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
Rinse figs, cover with water and boil 5 minutes. Stir in figs and rind. Sift together flour, sugar, baking powder and salt; add to liquid mixture and stir until all of dry mixture is moistened. Turn into a greased loaf pan (about 9 x 5 x 3 inches). Bake in a moderate (350°F.) oven about 1 1/4 hours.
