When adding tomato pieces to salads the Consumer Section says to be sure to add them just at the last minute because they tend to thin the dressing. The home economists also suggest cutting tomatoes lengthwise, from the stem end down, rather than crosswise, for salads and sandwiches because much less juice is lost this way.

Ripe, chilled tomatoes lend, themselves to all sorts of possibilities. They can be stuffed with meat, eggs, cheese or vegetable fillings; added to jellied salads; sliced or quartered and served on salad plates, or diced and lightly mixed with salad greens. They are good too, used in hors d'oeuvres or on the relish tray and the popularity of tomatoes in sandwiches should not be overlooked. Sprinkling a little finely chopped mint over the tomato slices gives the sandwiches quite an unusual flavour.
