Can Damages be Recovered in Ontario for a Breach of Promise to Marry?

THE BAPTISM OF JESUS
(Lesson for October 16)
Luke 3:1-8

Golden Text—Thou art my beloved Son: in thee I am well pleased.—Luke 3:22

THE LESSON AS A WHOLE
