The leper who came to Jesus then, was conscious of a deep, desperate need. What he had seen and heard of Jesus convinced him that here was one able to deliver him. It might be too much to say that in Jesus he recognized the Son of God, but at least he saw in Him one with whom was the power of God, as it was with Elijah and Elisha of old. He had no claim on Jesus that this power should be exerted in his behalf, but this was his only hope.
