

### Loses Licence, Markham MD Cycles



MARKHAM'S OLDEST PHYSICIAN, DR. A. L. HORE Couldn't get driver's license, now makes his calls by bicycle

Markham physician, Dr. Arthur L. Hore, who is 81, has solved his transportation problem—he's replaced his car with a bicycle. Two months ago his driver's license was cancelled because of his age. Fearing that he might have to discontinue his practice, he purchased a second-hand bicycle, and Dr. Hore still makes his rounds. He travels a distance of about four miles a day.

Dr. Hore is Markham's oldest physician, and started his practice in the village in 1910. He came from Little Britain, near Lindsay, where his parents operated a farm.

"I miss my car," said Dr. Hore, "but I certainly enjoy riding my bicycle." He thinks nothing of riding his bicycle to Toronto and back, a distance of more than 40 miles.

"It's good exercise for me. I've never lost the knack since my high school days," he says.

Dr. Hore obtained his first car in 1920. He has driven six cars, a total of 300,000 miles. For 20 years he was the medical officer of health for Markham Township.

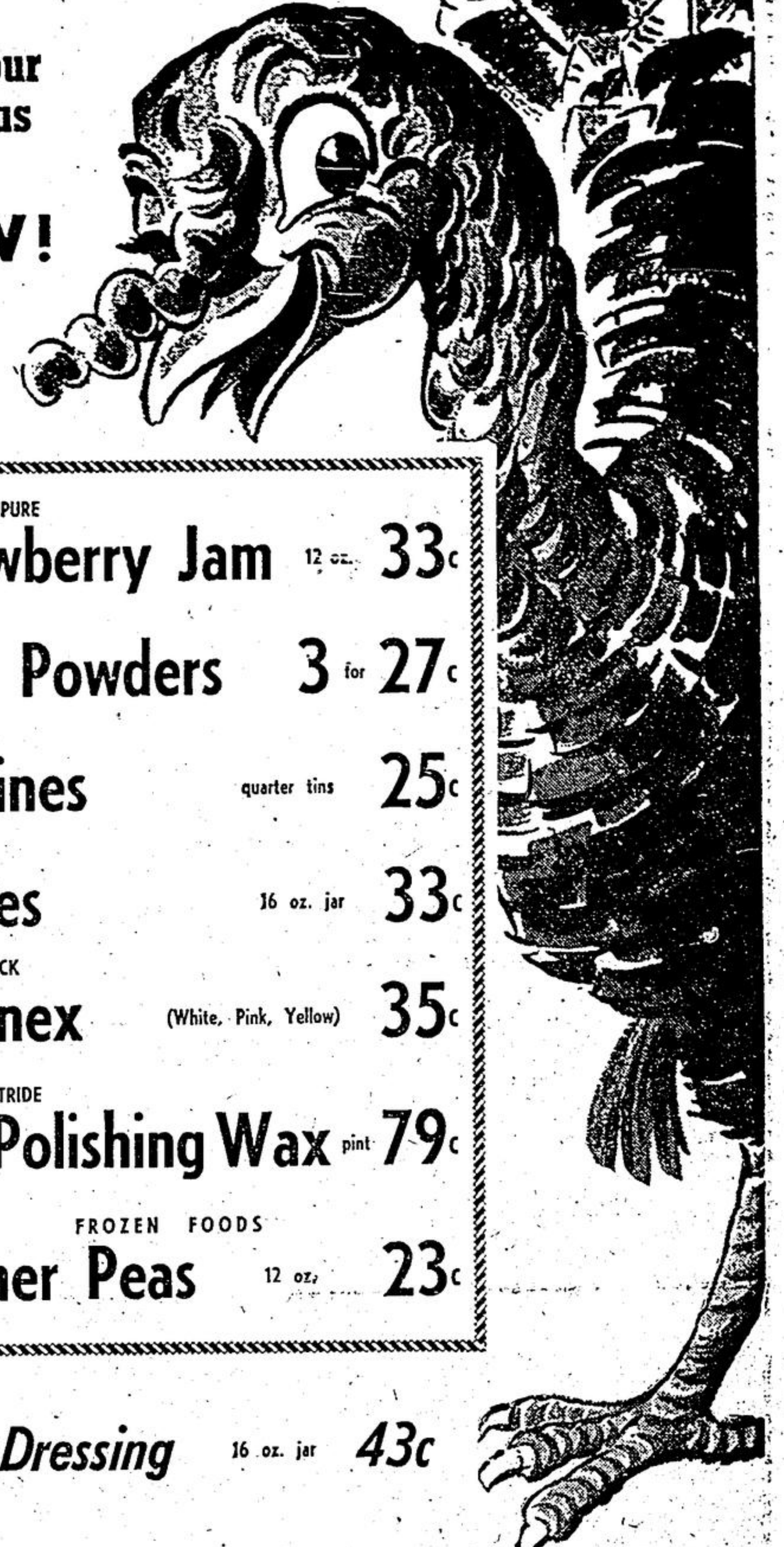
