To Replace Old Jail

The County jail, subject of much criticism in the past, is to be replaced by a new structure. The welcome news of Provincial Government approval of a new jail was relayed to County Council recently by Warden Harry Peel.

Both the select committee and grand juries have given high praise to the jail governor, Mr. James Sutherland, and his staff for a good job of housekeeping under difficult conditions. Security Good. Two years ago two men engineered an escape. One was picked up in a matter of hours, the other eluded capture until he was picked up across the line on another charge. The last execution took place some eight years ago.

Call For Tender. Accordingly the Provisional Council of the County engaged the services of Cumberland and Storm, a firm of architects of Toronto. Previously the firm had submitted plans. Authorization was given the architects to call for tenders for the county buildings. A tender submitted by James Wallace in the amount of \$5,795 was accepted.

Worst In Province. Three years ago the jail was termed the worst in the Province by a select committee. Grand juries down through the years have found many faults and brought in critical reports.
