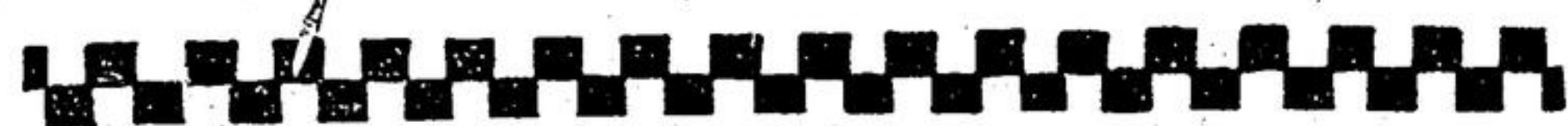
**Youth Service**

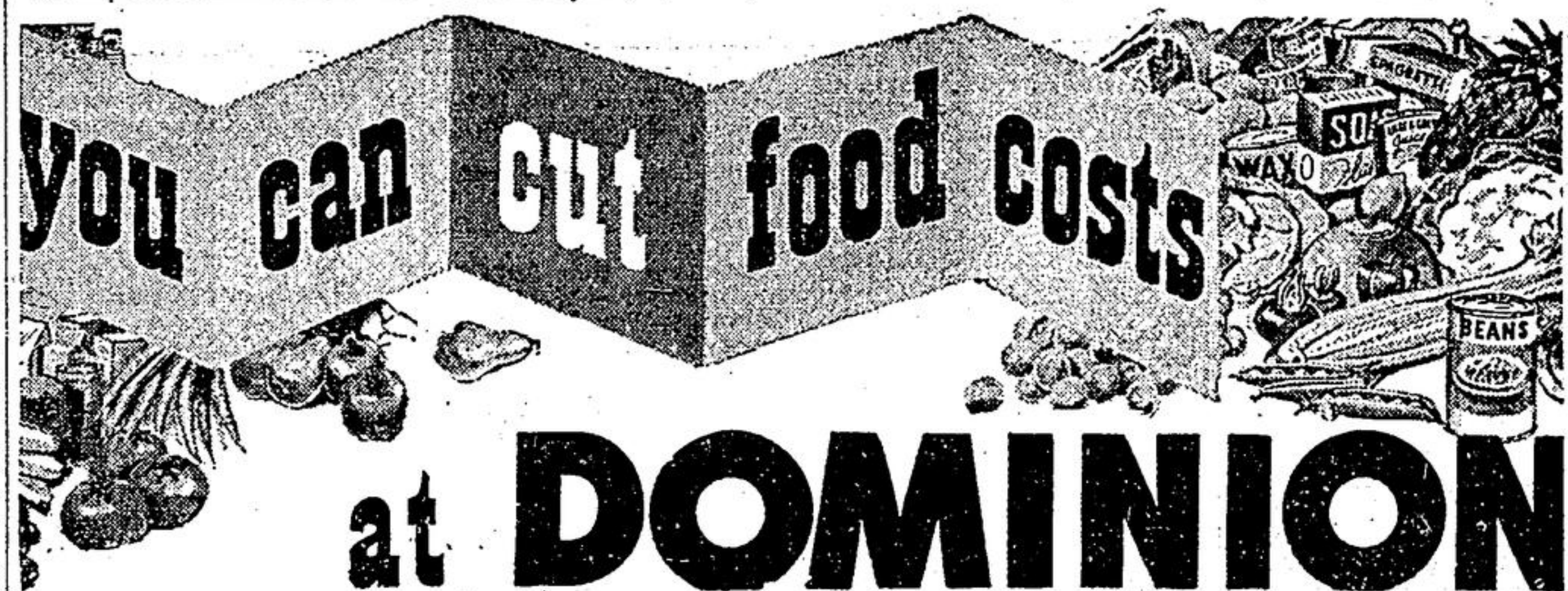
