Conservation Authorities Here Talk Amalgamation

Members of the RDHP Conservation authority, which is responsible for conservation in the watersheds of the Rouge River, Duffin's Creek, Highland Creek and Pelee Island Creek have been studying a new conservation authority measure which is coming before the present session of the legislature. This bill proposes to dissolve the four existing conservation authorities in and around Toronto, and to set up a new authority to be known as the "Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority."

members of the present RDHP Conservation authority have been informed that the new amendment is not to become effective until 1957. The authority has therefore continued with its present representatives and elected officers. C. R. Purcell, Scarborough, has been re-elected as chairman and Win. Timbers, Stouffville, as vice-chairman. The representatives on the RDHP Authority from the Ontario County municipalities are as follows: Town of Ajax, Deputy Reeve Roger G. Conant; Pickering township, W. H. Westney and H. G. Mitchell; Pickering village, J. H. Purvis; Uxbridge township, Robert L. Nesbitt.

2,000 Holsteins Fly To South America

The 2,000th dairy animal to leave Canada by air was a Holstein Bull worth \$15,000. Rosaf Reflection Nero left Malton airport February 28 for Medellin, Colombia. There he will join the herd of Dr. Braulio Henao and Dr. Wm. Gil. The purchase price is the largest received at a Canadian auction in 1955, when he was bought at the Sale of Stars last fall. Nero is from the Rosaf herd of Dr. Hector I. Astengo, Brampton, Ontario, and was recently named All-Canadian Bull calf for 1955.

Rabies Pass Wildlife To Dogs, to Humans

Vaccination of cats and dogs against rabies prevents possible spread of the disease from wild life, through these animal pets to humans. Dr. K. F. Wells, Veterinary Director General, Department of Agriculture, Ottawa, states effectiveness of vaccination has been shown by the fact that of 15,000 dogs vaccinated during the present outbreak in Northern Ontario, no case of rabies has occurred in dogs that were vaccinated. Spread of rabies into settled areas has occurred chiefly through wild life sources. Of 100 cases confirmed in Canada during the present series of outbreaks, 19 were dogs, 55 were wild life—chiefly foxes, lynx, wolves and coyotes; 26 occurred in domestic animals—cattle, swine, and cats. In Ontario, out of 71 cases confirmed, 12 were dogs, 16 domestic animals and 43 wild life. There have been no cases reported of rabies being contracted by human beings during the present series of outbreaks. Vaccination of all dogs and cats, in areas where confirmed cases of the disease are discovered is one of the surest methods of preventing its spread to people, particularly in thickly populated communities.

VANDORF TO HAVE TWO ROOM SCHOOL

Four acres have been purchased by Vandorf School Board for a new two-room schoolhouse to be erected on property formerly owned by Mrs. Bertha Dewsbury, directly south of the Township offices in the village of Vandorf. At present there are approximately 56 children attending the 1-room school which will be sold later. One teacher is in charge attempting to carry on in these crowded conditions. To cost in the neighbourhood of \$43,000, the Board anticipates the building will be ready next fall when pupils return to school.
