

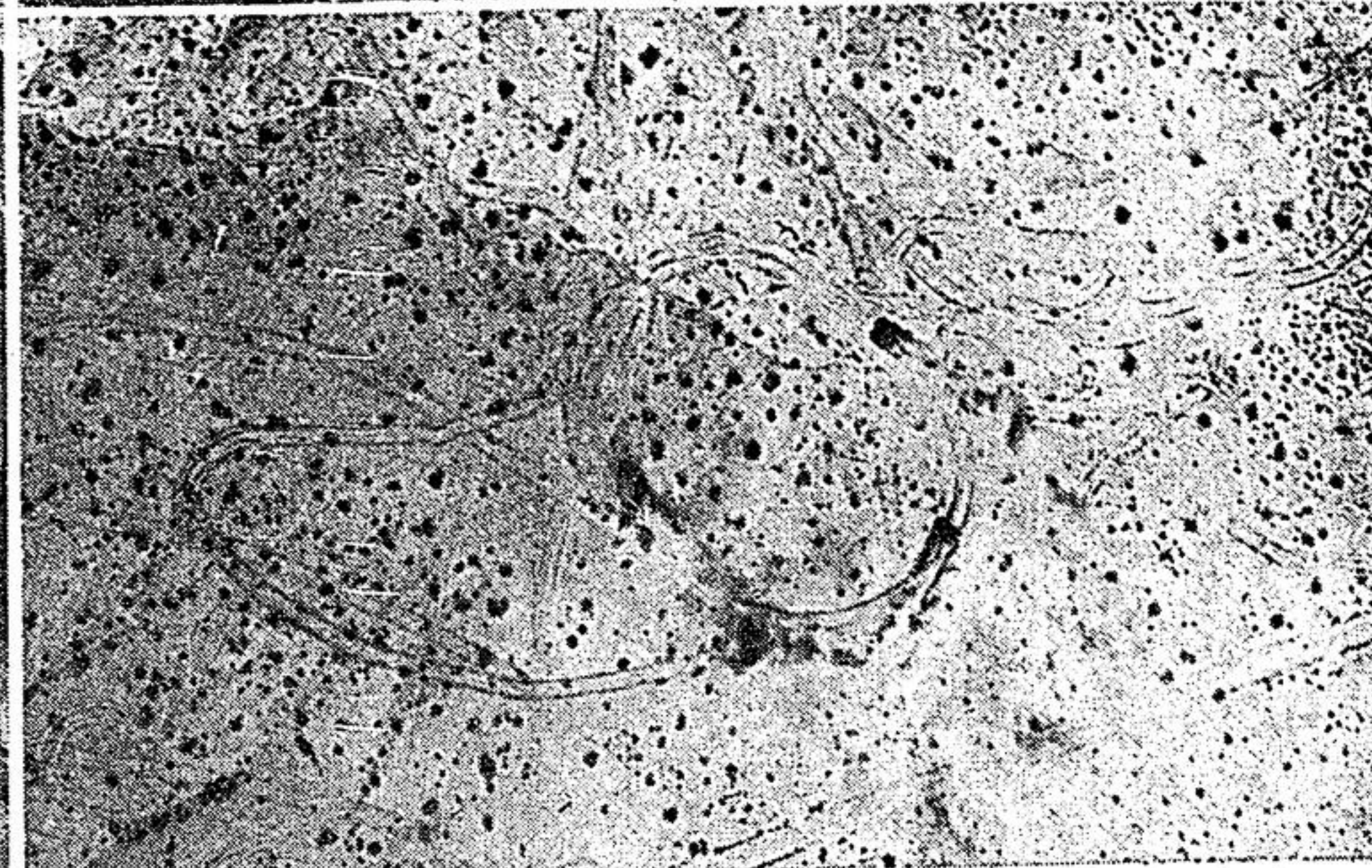
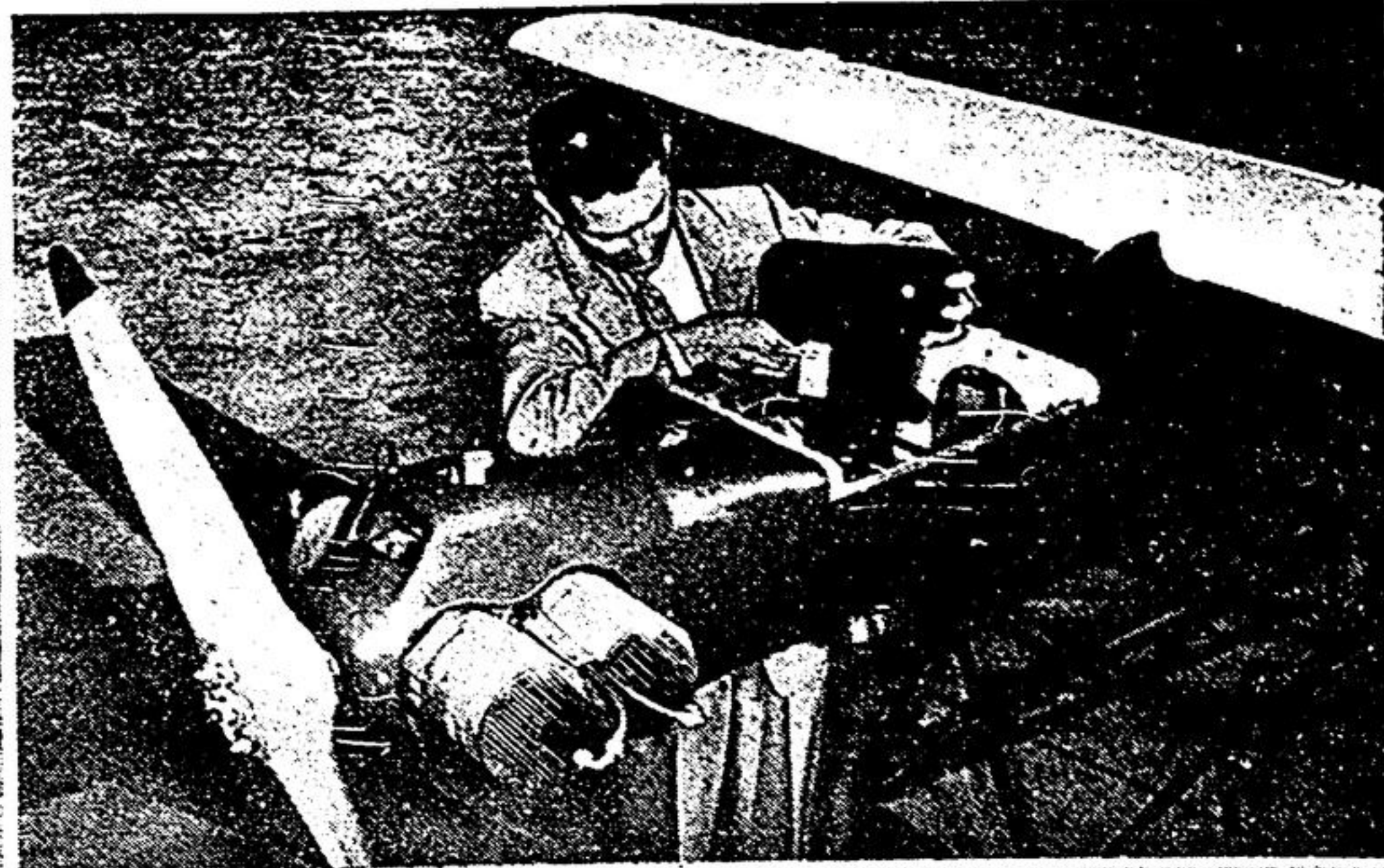

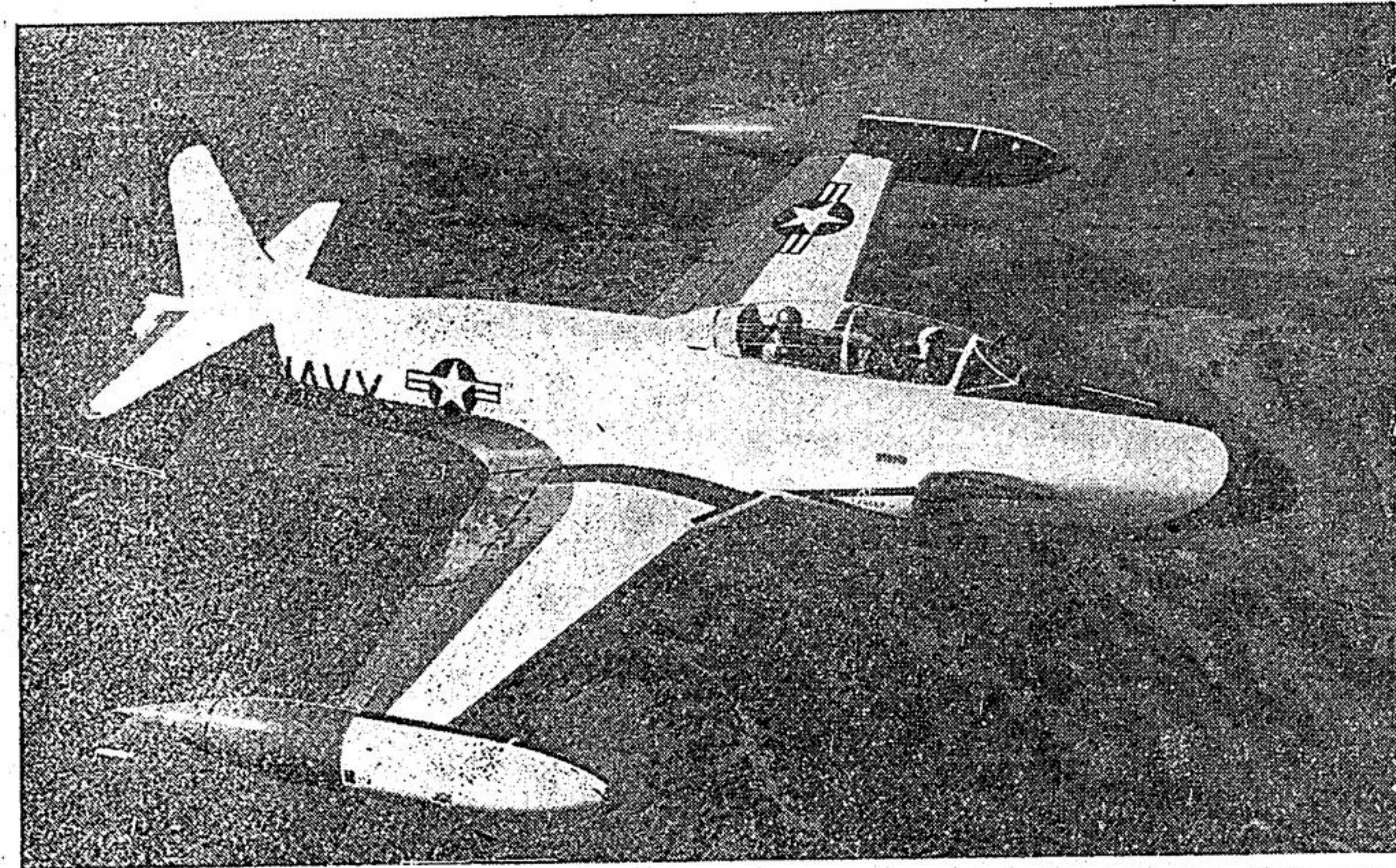

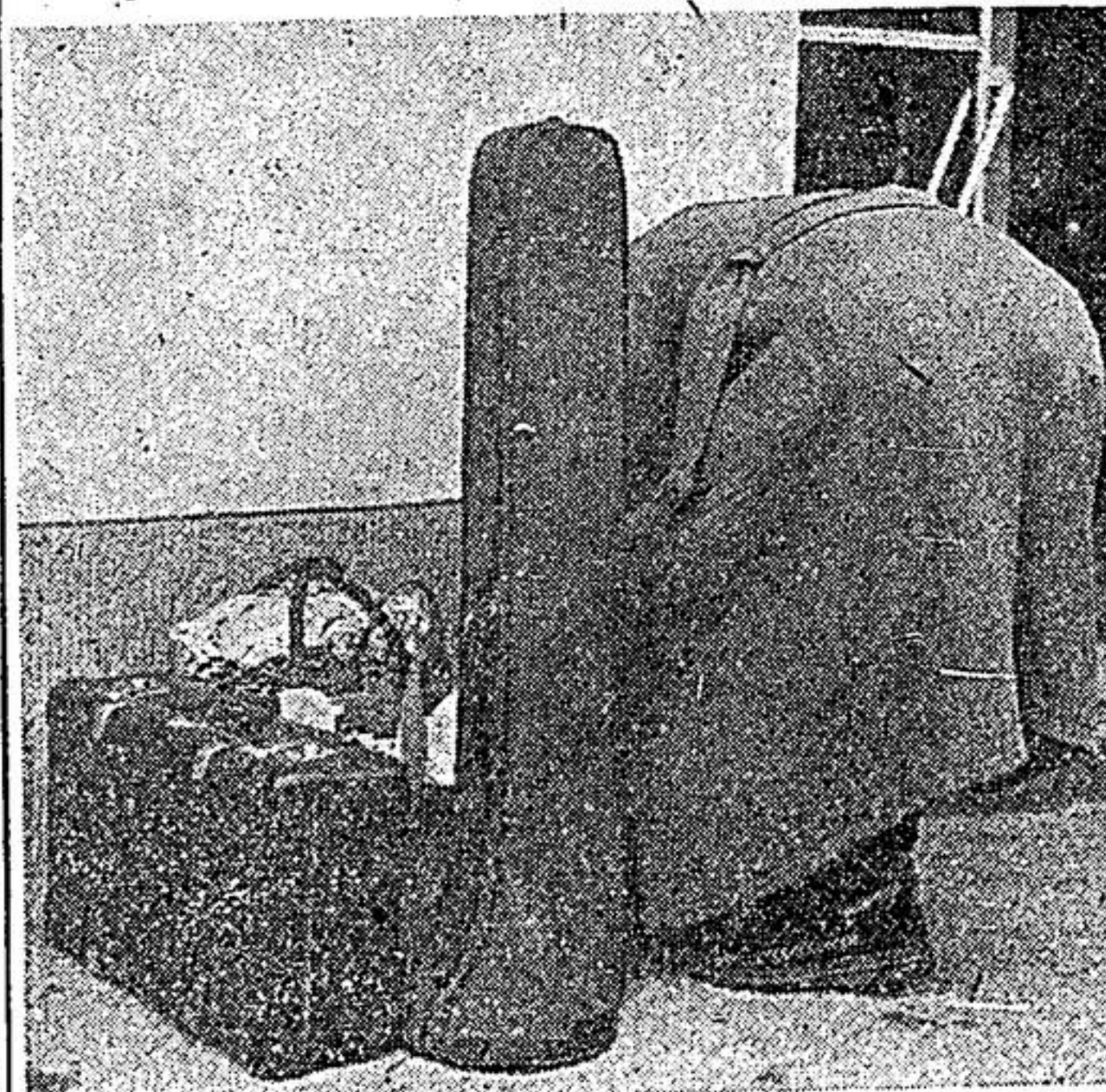

PRESSURE ON, THEY MOVE WEST

DURING 1955, more than 250,000 East Germans fled to the west and freedom while the Russians cracked down in a new drive to Sovietize their occupation zone still further.
