Old Timer Tells of Steam Plants for Logging and Threshing

On this lane (east of the Church) that I mentioned, there was a thriving sawmill run by a stationary steam engine. Oscar Baker or Everett would well remember about it, also Bert. I have been told by my mother that James Brodie used to run that mill, for she worked for those people when she was a young girl. There was a dwelling house just east of the mill, and a stable, for I well remember about this stable.

I was down around there with my oldest brother. He noticed a bee nest at the south side of it. He had a long handled shovel or spade with him and tore off a board and he and I ate the honey. There was a fair allowance for both of us, but I guess he earned what he got, for he was well stung by those bees.

Farther east out this lane was another log dwelling house and log stable, northwest of the town of Stouffville's dog ponds. My mother and father lived in that dwelling, also my father's mother. Three of my older sisters and my brother (the one whom the bees stung) were born in that log dwelling. This Mr. Brodie and the older generation of the Brodies who still live around west of Stouffville, came out with my mother's mother from Scotland, on the same sailing vessel, in the early part of the 19th century. To be exact, it was in either 1813 or 1818 — it is on my grandmother's tombstone back of the Baptist Church in Claremont.

This sawmill was later run by Mr. John Jamieson and Mr. Joel Baker, grandfather of Eugene and Everett's, according to what I have heard older people say. They were a good pair of business heads and honest to the letter. As soon as I was old enough to walk, I used to go down the lane, that led to this mill with my brother. He used to work there some, by the day. This house I mentioned, east of the mill, was occupied by the sawyer, Abner Mapes, and his wife.

John McNeil was the father of the two boys who used to go to Bloomington School—or am I right when I say Bloomington? He also ran a steam threshing outfit in the fall, and used to thresh east of Baker Hill. His oldest son, Willie, ran the engine. Tom Lewis went with him one season and I well remember the fine team of chestnut coloured horses he pulled the threshing engine around with. There was no trouble to get water to supply this steam engine, for the sawmill, as there were springs galore around there then, and still are.

This Mr. Jamieson who was in partnership with Mr. Baker was a good stockman. He also kept some fine sheep and cattle on his farm. I well remember his fine sheep. Some of them got out on the railroad and were killed. I remember the evening he gave my mother a large piece of lamb. He built that fine house Gordon Ratcliff now owns. Job Jordan used to work there and my mother's youngest sister. She and Job must have agreed very well, for he has told me he often drove around with her in the horse-and-buggy days. The last conversation I had with him, he was asking about her. This Mr. Jamieson must have been an extra good natured gentleman to put up with any
