Milk Producers Assn., Dist. 5, Hold Annual Banquet
 Despite a fog-bound countryside, there was a good attendance at Buttonville Hall on Tuesday evening of last week, when the local Milk Producers' Association, Dist. No. 5, held their annual banquet.
 The guest speaker, Mr. Arthur Musgrave of Thornbury, whose topic was "Co-operatives," proved witty and well-informed. He believes that Co-operatives are an excellent way of doing business, but to be of use they must be used. He advised dairy farmers to take advantage of the local unit on Highway 401.
 Following Mr. Musgrave's speech a film was shown on the proper use of the milking machine. It pointed out that when milking machines are properly used they prove more beneficial to cattle than hand milking.
