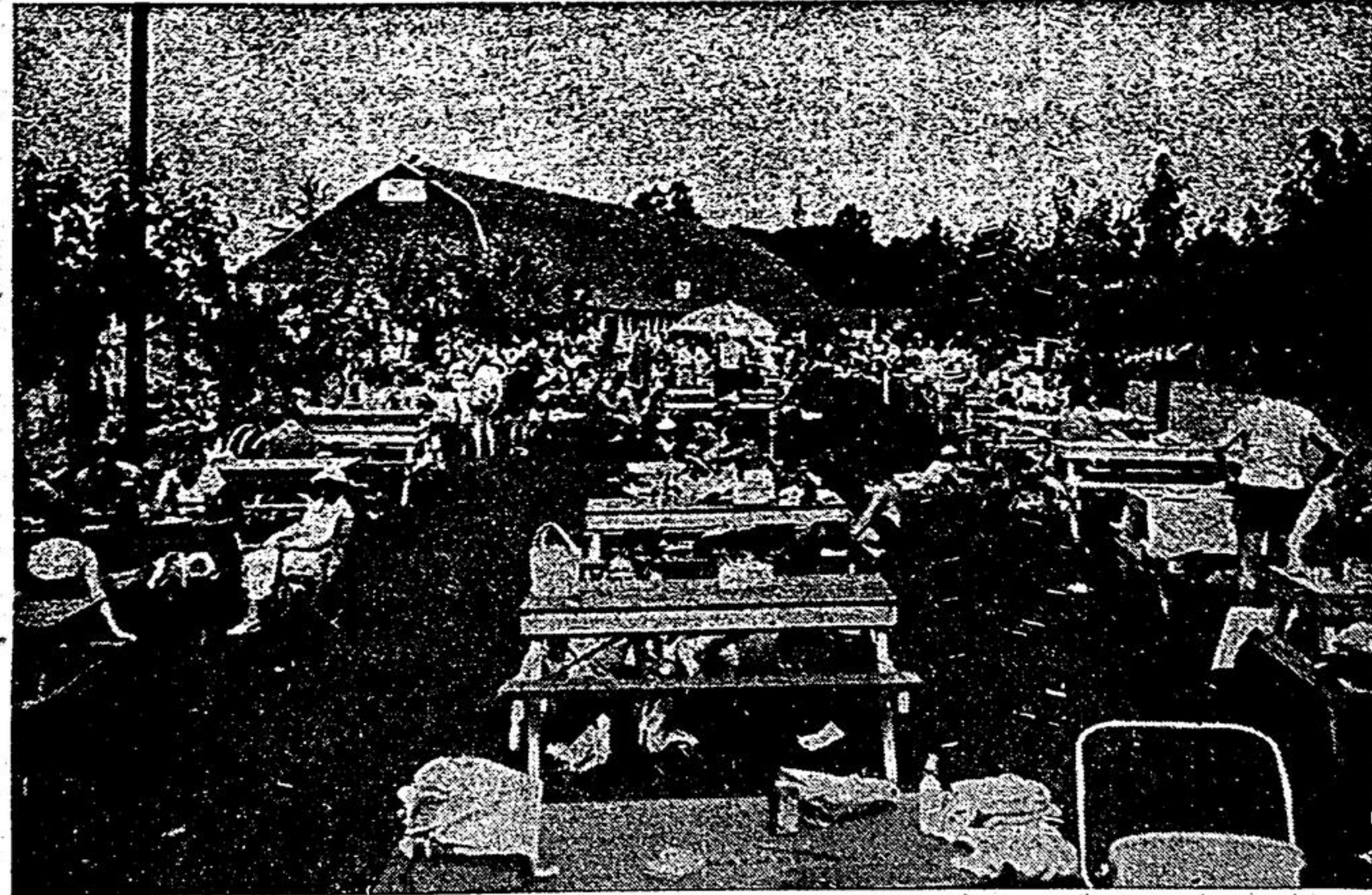


## Greetings From the Ministerial Association
