The Gideons will have charge of the church service next Sunday at 9:45 a.m., Sunday School at 11 o'clock.

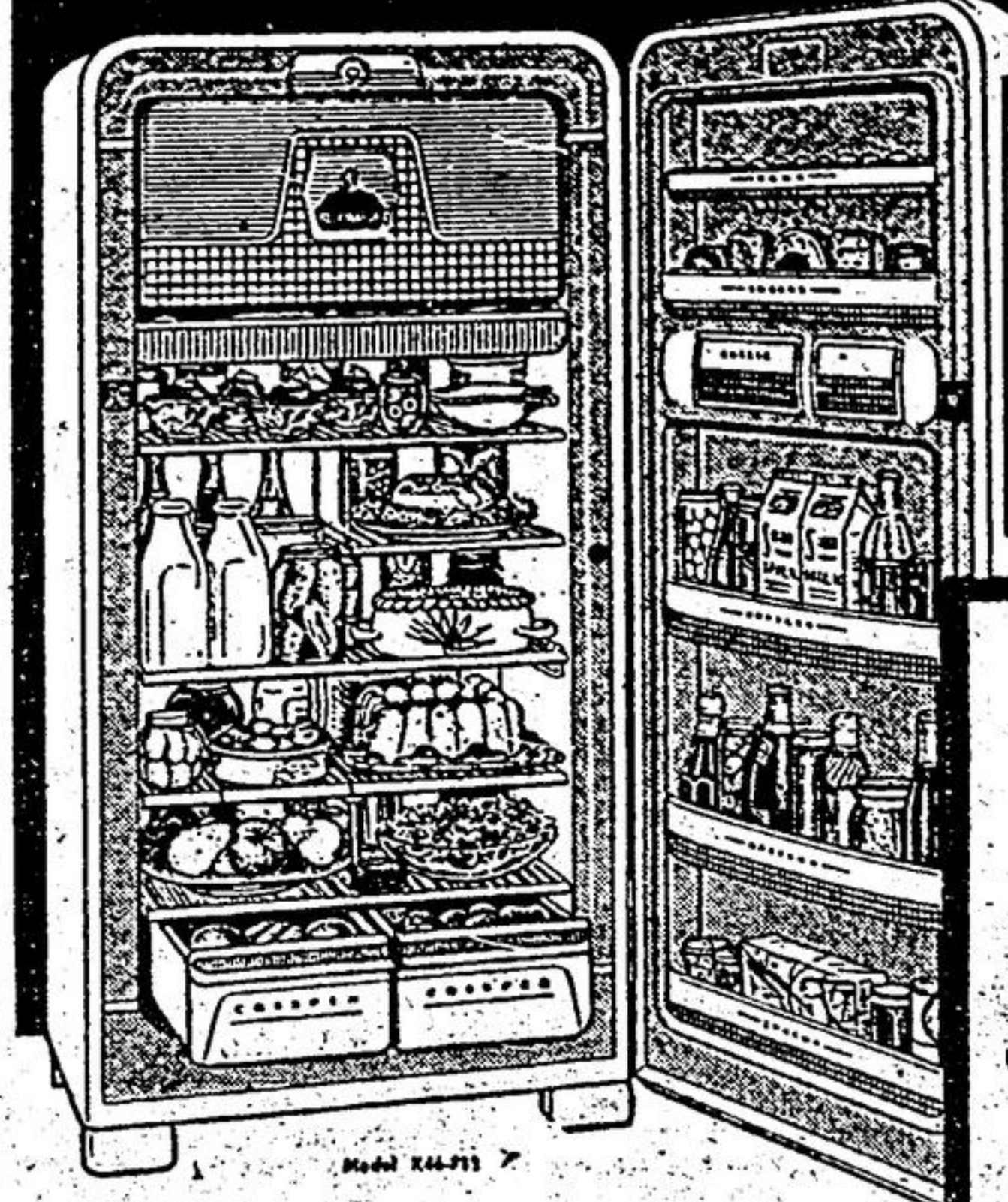
