It was the second Canadian championship victory for Timbers, who won the Silver Plow at Cobourg, Ontario, in 1953, and subsequently was on the two-man team which represented Canada at the World Match in Elre in 1954...

The Association meeting of Baptist Churches in the Trent Valley Association will be in the Uxbridge church on Oct. 10. May Goodwood be well represented.

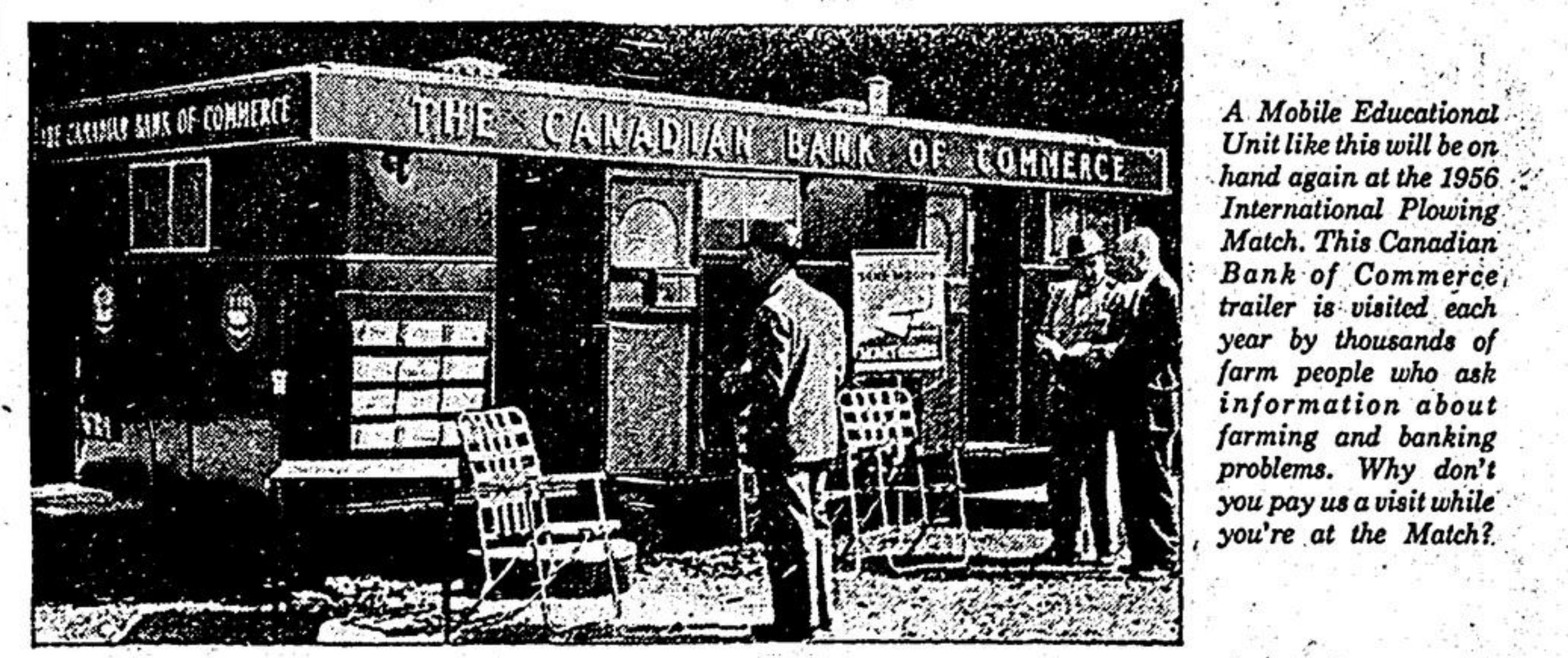
