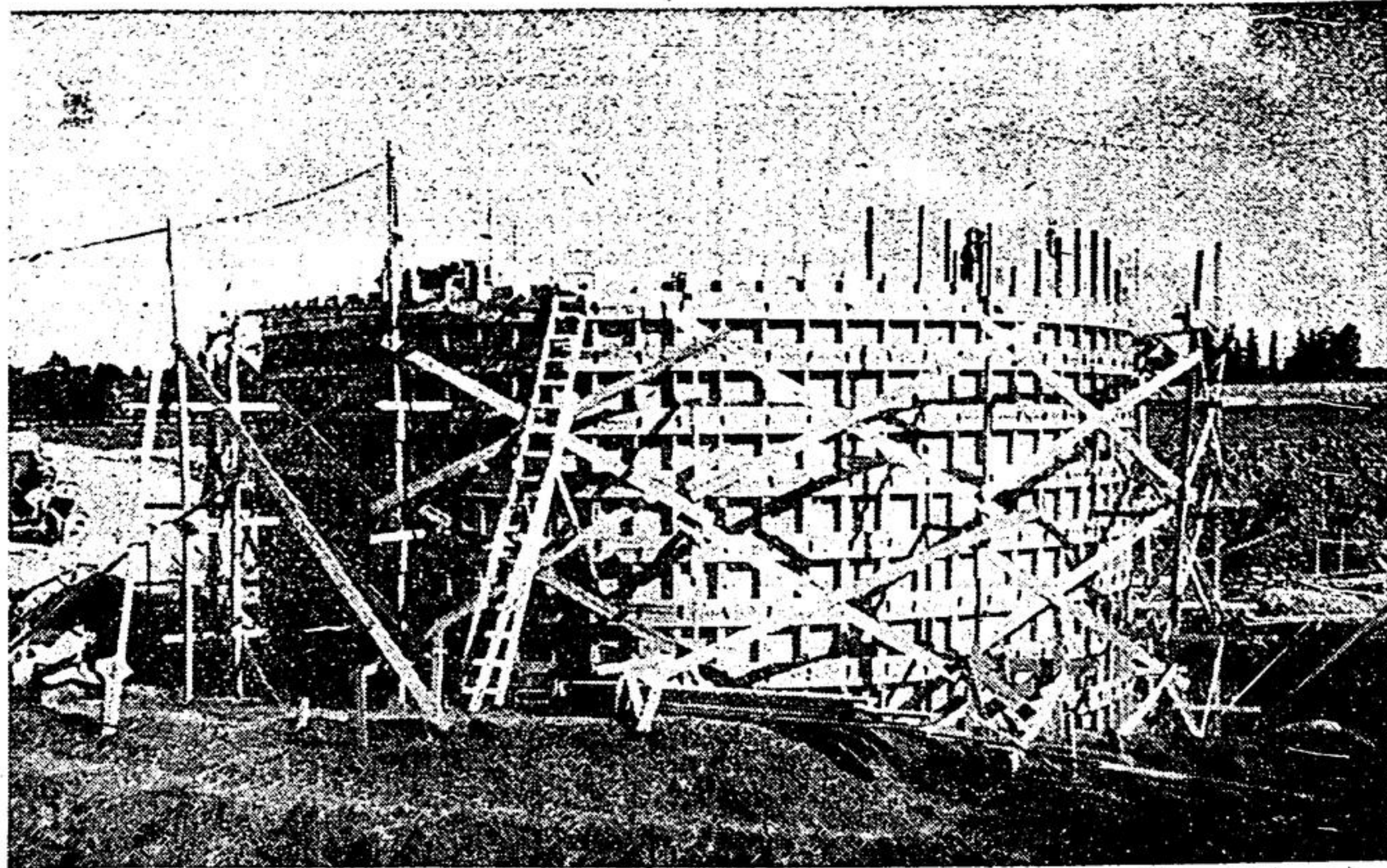
At noon hour the same day, we were given lunch by the Italian Tourist Dept. in a building erected by King Farouk.
