# The Sunday School Lesson

**JESUS BAPTIZED AND TEMPTED**  
(Lesson for January 13)  
Matthew 3 and 4

**GOLDEN TEXT** — Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve. —Matt. 4:10

**THE LESSON AS A WHOLE**  
Approach to the Lesson  
In last week's Approach we saw the four main movements in the earthly life of Christ as given in Matthew's Gospel.

1. The genealogy (1:1-17), in which Matthew presents Christ as the son of Abraham and the Son of David. It is generally accepted that this is the genealogy of Joseph, and it will be noticed that the line comes through Jehoiachin, known also as Jeconiah and Coniah, against whom Jeremiah pronounced the curse, declaring him childless so far as the throne of David was concerned (Jer. 22:30.) Hence our Lord does not derive His right to the throne of David through Joseph.

2. The birth and infancy (1:18 to 2:23). The story of the birth is given from Joseph's point of view, telling his struggle in discovering the state of Mary, and the manner in which God revealed to him the great truth of the virgin birth. The accompanying story here is of the Wise Men from the East; just as the accompanying story in Luke's account is that of the shepherds.

3. The forerunner (3:1-12). Here Matthew tells briefly of the ministry of John the Baptist, who came to herald the coming of Christ while engaging in a call to repentance, signified by baptism.

4. The inauguration (3:13-17), where we are told of Christ's coming up to John's baptism, and of the threefold token of the Father's approval, the opening of the heavens, the descent of the dove, and the voice from Heaven.

5. The temptation (4:1-11), in which our Lord was put to the proof in face-to-face combat with the tempter, Satan. This completed the period of preparation, and from that experience Jesus went forth to establish His headquarters in Capernaum, and to commence His Galilean ministry. It will be noticed that our lesson deals with the final stages of the preparation.

Verse 3:16—"And Jesus . . . baptized . . . the heavens were opened . . . the Spirit of God descending like a dove . . ." The attention of Heaven was focused upon Jesus in this moment of committal. This was not merely a subjective experience, within the mind of Jesus, but outward phenomena perceived by the senses. Not only Jesus saw the dove-like appearance of the Holy Spirit but John the Baptist saw it also (John 1:32-34).

Verse 17—" . . . a voice from heaven . . . This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." The inward sense of being well pleasing was a constant factor in the life of Jesus, but twice the voice of approval spoke audibly from Heaven — at Jordan, and on the Mount of Transfiguration. See also John 12:28. Each instance was connected with our Lord's self-committal to the cause.

Chap. 4:1—" . . . led up of the Spirit . . . to be tempted." The first action of the Spirit, newly come in anointing power upon Jesus, was to lead Him into the place of temptation, not away from it! See the strong word used by Mark (1:12).

Verse 2—" . . . when he had fasted . . . he was afterward hungry." For what was happening during those forty days, see Luke 4:2. The three temptations described were the climax of the long conflict, when the Lord was weakened physically, by the long fast.

Verse 3—" . . . If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread." This was not a suggestion that Jesus was not the Son of God, but a temptation to use His prerogatives and powers as Son of God to minister to His human and now poignant need.

Verse 4—" . . . Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word . . . of God." In quoting Deuteronomy 8:3 our Lord was not repudiating His deity, but was nevertheless taking His place as man, subject to and dependent upon God. At the same time He affirmed the spiritual nature of man.

Verse 5—" . . . into the holy city . . . on a pinnacle of the temple." Whether this was bodily transportation or vision is a matter of dispute — and not very profitable dispute. For "pinnacle" read "wing." The descent seems to have been into a deep gorge.

Verse 6—" . . . cast thyself down . . . He shall give his angels charge concerning thee . . . lest thou dash thy foot against a stone." Satan challenges Jesus to demonstrate His professed faith in God by a reckless leap from the lofty wing into the abyss below, on the basis of a promise in Psalm 91:11, 12, commonly accepted as having Messianic application. Note the omission in the quotation.

Verse 7—"Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God." Once again Jesus takes His place with man, responsible to submit to God rather than tempt Him. Tempting God was one of the sins of Israel (Deut. 6:16).

### THIS WEEK'S RECIPE

**Coconut Sugar Cookies**  
(Makes 24)  
2 cups sifted flour  
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup butter or shortening  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 eggs, well beaten  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1 cup shredded coconut  
Sift together dry ingredients. Cream shortening, add sugar and cream well. Add eggs and beat thoroughly. Then add dry ingredients (flour, baking powder and salt). Blend in vanilla and coconut. Chill dough until firm enough to roll. Roll dough on floured board 1/4-inch thick and cut with a floured 3-inch cutter. Sprinkle with sugar and bake on ungreased cookie sheet in moderate (375°F.) oven for 12 minutes or until golden.

sans, coconut, brown sugar and butter. Serve with ice cream or whipped cream.

Blend white steamed rice with slivered almonds and fry until light brown in butter. This makes a wonderful side dish to serve with fried chicken.

When you're broiling cheese and bacon sandwiches broil a few peaches sprinkled with brown sugar alongside them and you can have sandwich and fruit in an appetizing combination.

Caution: quarts make a pretty salad when you fill them with pineapple chunks and garnish with cooked prunes filled with cottage cheese topped with walnut halves.

### TO RECONSIDER NEWMARKET APPLICATIONS

The Canadian Broadcasting Corporation will reconsider the applications for radio stations at Richmond Hill and Newmarket, town council was informed by letter last week by Minister of Transport Marler.

In its reply, council stated that it would appreciate being informed of the date of the hearing as a delegation will attend the meeting. It added that council is of the opinion that Newmarket is more centrally located for a station to serve York County.

Mr. Marier said that it had been decided to refer the radio station applications back to the CBC for reconsideration and rehearing because of the large number of representations that were received from many sources. He suggested that the CBC will schedule an early meeting at which time council's representations could be presented and recommended that council make whatever arrangements are necessary so that its evidence will be ready to put forward to the CBC Board of Governors.

Council also wrote to the CBC informing it of Mr. Marier's letter. Council added that it was "most desirous" of having representation at this meeting and requested notification of the hearing date.
