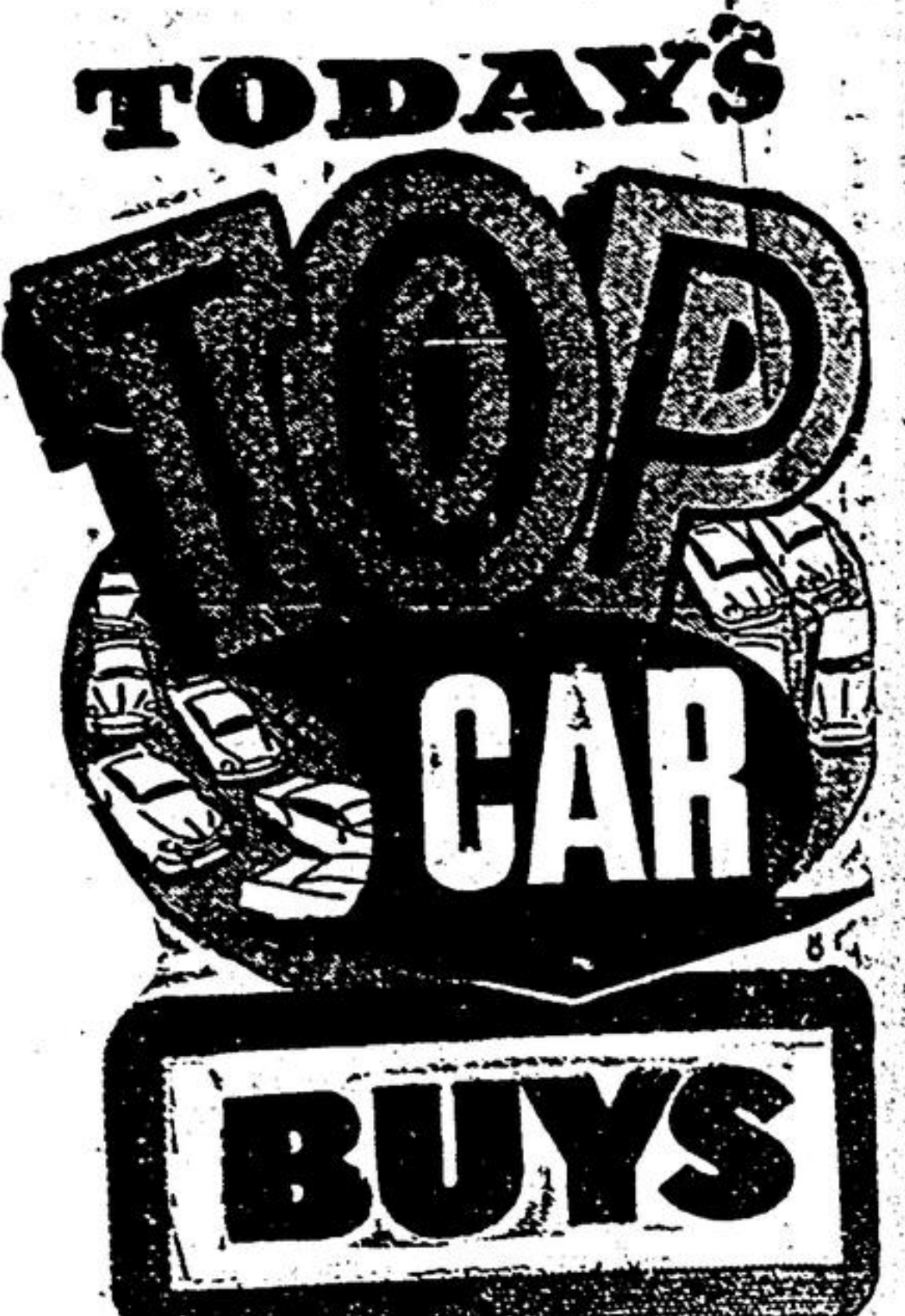
Stouffville-Markham Soccer Teams To Merge: Word was received this week that the Stouffville and Markham soccer teams will join forces this summer to field one club.
