\$2,000 Top Price for M.H. Holstein

In the five years of its existence, the Massey-Harris Farms herd of Holsteins at Milliken, Ontario, established itself as one of the leading herds in Canada. Bearing this out was last year's average production of 15,700 lbs. of milk by each member of the milking herd. This was on twice-a-day milking, too.

Reflecting the high esteem in which cattlemen hold this herd, was the top price of \$2,000 and the total of \$29,840 for an average of \$460 on 64 head at the dispersal sale held May 27 at the farm.

Highlighting the sale was a family group headed by Helen Pietje Posch Illehee, an Excellent cow who has three times been Grand Champion at the York County Black & White

Day, and who was nominated for All-Canadian Aged Cow in 1952. Carrying her ten years of age lightly, she brought \$2,000. Then her two-months-old heifer calf sold for \$1,000 followed by an older daughter, a bred heifer at \$1,075. All three went to Romandale Farms, Gormley, Ont.

Miss Barbara Y. Royle, Oakville, Ontario, who operates her own dairy farm and herd of 43 head of Holsteins because, as she says, "I like cows and feel that I might as well do what I want to do," paid the second highest price of \$1,200 for a 3-year-old daughter of the six times All-Canadian and 4 times Royal Winter Fair Grand Champion, Rockwood Rocket Tone. Barbara also bought a 6-month-old heifer calf at \$350.

Roy N. Johncox, Palmyra, N. Y., paid \$1,125 for an 8-year-old cow, and J. M. McIntosh, Aurora, Ont., \$1,000 for a seven-year-old cow.

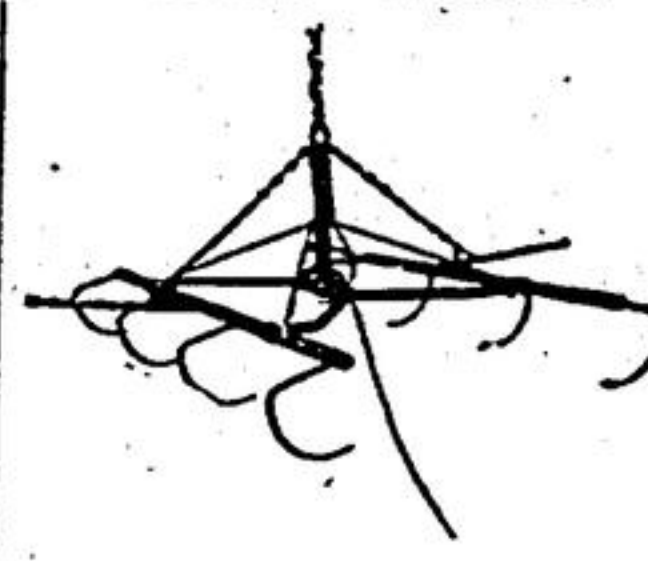
The three-year-old herdsire, M.O.W. Pabst Posch, brought \$875 on the bid of E. B. Seedhouse of Dane Hill, Uptergrove, Ontario. He is a son of Glenkindie Opal Posch, highest living twice-a-day milking lifetime producer in Canada, with well over 200,000 lbs. of milk.

Big buyer of the day was R. R. Dennis, of Toronto, who secured 18 head. Nine head went

to the U.S.A. and five were bought by Tom Hays of Oakville, for export to Latin America.

Six bulls averaged \$320 each, 27 milking females \$579, 9 bred heifers \$494, 14 open yearlings \$262, and 8 heifer calves \$266. Other high prices included: \$900 paid by Edward N. Derr, New Windsor, Md., for a three-year-old heifer; \$500 paid by S. J. Sherman, Lindsay, for a three-month-old heifer calf; \$950 paid by Dane Hill Acres for a nine-year-old; \$825 paid by Allan F. Jones, Jamestown, N.Y., for a bred heifer; and \$700 paid by R. R. Dennis, Toronto, for a three-year-old.

STRAWBERRY ROOT WEEVIL CONTROL

Effective control of the Strawberry Root Weevil can be achieved through the use of the chemicals Aldrin or Chlordane. H. P. Richardson, Officer-in-Charge of the Entomology Field Station, Science Service, Morden, Manitoba, says this can be done by applying the chemicals as a dust to soil and roots before planting or as a spray to foliage before blossoms open and again immediately after harvest.

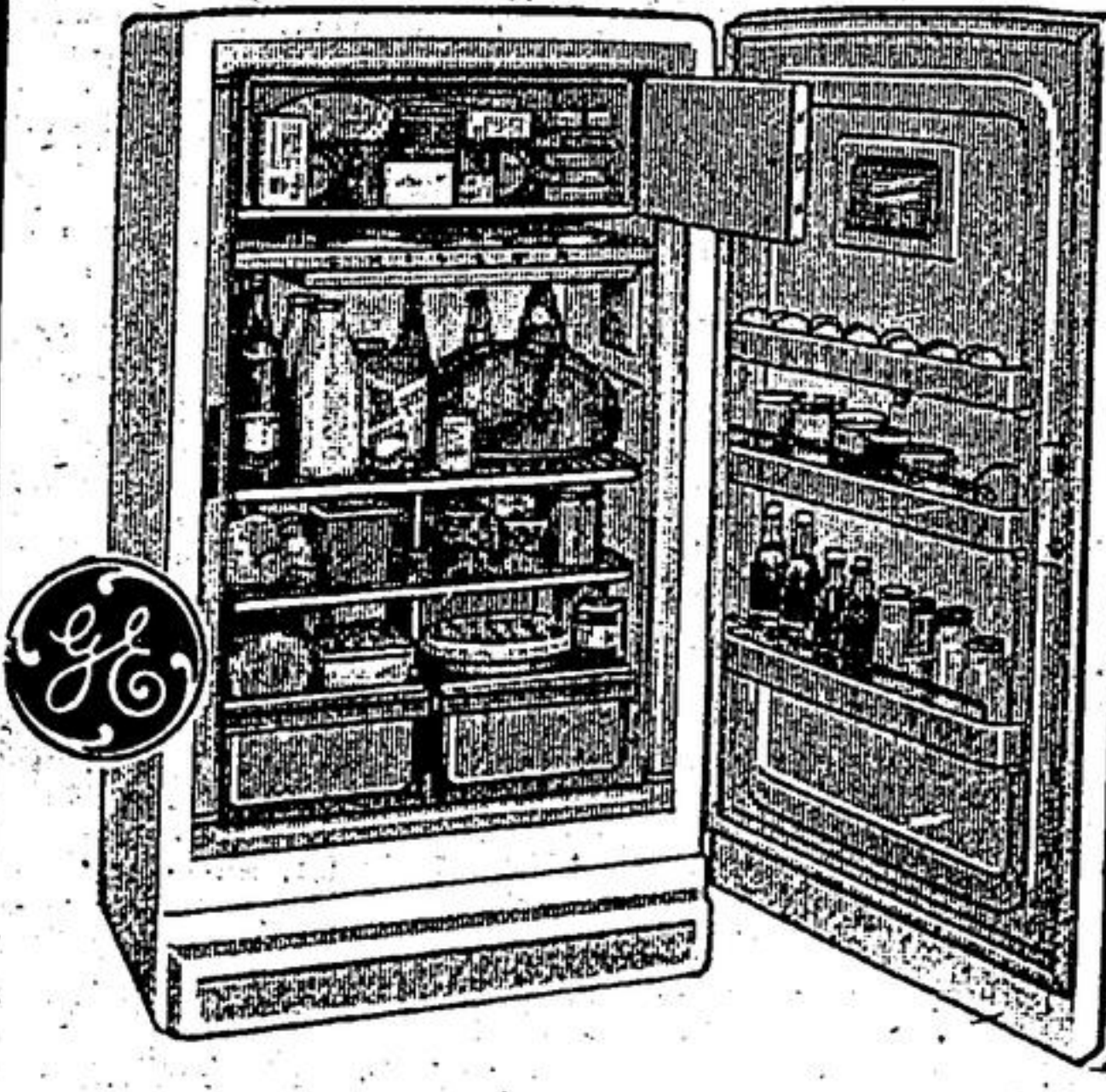
