Historical Survey of The Weekly Newspapers of the County of York

(This survey written by Jean McFall is part of "The York Pioneer," a publication of the York Pioneer and Historical Society and is being presented in The Tribune in two instalments.) One group of pioneers about whom little has been written is that of the Fourth Estate—the editors and proprietors of the little weekly newspapers which flourished and failed with such rapidity during the early period of our history.

York Sentinel. The latest number in the Provincial Archives is dated November 13th, 1856, but there is nothing to indicate that this was the end. It may have fallen victim to the difficulties encountered by Mr. Porter. Newmarket had at least three other weeklies before 1900. The Courier began publication late in 1867 under G. M. Binns. It was a four-page issue, "published in the Conservative interest."

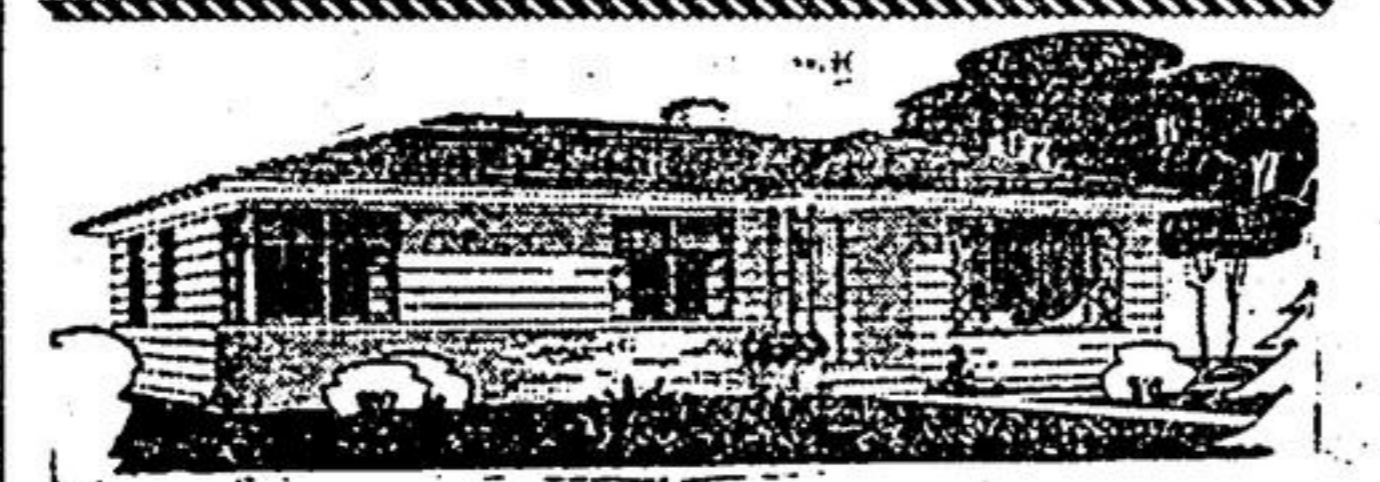

"What is an Editor?" An editor is a mule whose business is to investigate a newspaper. He writes editorials, grinds out poetry, inserts deaths and weddings, sorts manuscripts, keeps a waste-basket, blows up the 'devil,' steals matter, fits other people's battles, sells his paper for a dollar and fifty cents a year, takes white beans and apple sass for pay when he can get it, razes a large family, works nineteen hours out of twenty-four, noze no Sunday, gets damned by everybody, lives poor, dies middle-aged, and often broken-hearted leaves no mummy, is rewarded for a life of toil by a short but free obituary puff in the newspaper."

The newspaper history of York County begins in 1798, when the Upper Canada Gazette, established in 1793 in Newark, followed Governor Simcoe to the new town of York on the north shore of Lake Ontario. During the next thirty years there were other attempts to found newspapers, some more successful than others.

As far as we can discover, the first newspaper published in the county outside of Toronto is one whose name has been forgotten. It was printed in the little settlement of Markham sometime around 1829 by Henry William Peterson, but when he died, his son could find no copy of the paper among his father's belongings.
