# MAUSOLEUM

For the Stouffville Cemetery, will provide a clean dry burial above ground at a cost of less than the average ground burial.

#### Dedicated to the Spirit of Immortality

Arrangements have been completed with the Stouffville Cemetery Board, for the construction of an Outdoor Garden Type Mausoleum.

The beautifully landscaped grounds of the Stouffville Cemetery will have this stately and inspiring Mausoleum shown on the above photograph. This monolithic structure will be as fine as money, art and modern science can build. The building is to be of steel reinforced concrete with seven scientific vapour barriers which will prevent moisture or dampness from entering the building.

The exterior walls will be of imported white bedford limestone, imported P.V.E. marble and bronze all of which have been carefully selected for their strength and durability.

The beauty of the Mausoleum will bring comfort to the bereaved and will remind the visitor — not of death — but of the happy memories of life. The Mausoleum like the Cemetery will be endowed for perpetual care. The growing demand for the Outdoor Garden Type Mausoleum is shown by the fact that so many have been, and are being built. This will now accord residents of Stouffville and surrounding districts the opportunity to participate in a mode of burial that heretofore was not available.

### Down Through the Centuries :

A thousand years before Christ the pyramid of King Cheops of Egypt was old and mysterious. According to Greek historian Herodotus, it took one-hundred thousand workers twenty years to build at a cost of more than twenty-five billion dollars and pauperized the people of the Egyptian Empire. In 350 B.C. Mausolus, King of Caria in Asia Minor died, and his Queen Artemesia, erected a magnificent tomb in which to place his remains. These structures became known as two of the seven wonders of the ancient world. In modern times all structures serving a similar purpose have taken their name from King Mausolus and are known as Mausoleums.

Our Lord Jesus Christ was laid to rest in a rock hewn tomb or sepulchre and early Christians followed that custom. The wealthier class of people have used this mode of burial exclusively for many centuries. The Kings and Queens of England, the American Presidents and National heroes of all countries are buried in tombs or Mausoleums. Until comparatively recent times such structures were built to accommodate the remains of a single individual or family.

### A Thing of Beauty is a Joy Forever

Private tombs or mausoleums have always been too costly for any except the rich or great. In recent years however, the Ontario Mausoleum Company Limited have been building Community Mausoleums, for families desiring to provide a clean dry resting place for their loved ones.

### Peace of Mind

What treasures can you give to match the blessings of peace of mind — to free those dear to you from the haunting fear of unpreparedness on a day that comes without warning? The deed to your family companionette crypt is as indispensable to your family's security program as your insurance policy, your savings and your will.

Death is no respecter of person or persons, sooner or later every family must face hereavement. The average death follows a period of heavy expenses, and in many instances there is a loss of income. The insurance and savings intended for the care of the loved ones or the education of the children is depleted and the family left in debt.

(2) At present the cost is no more and in most cases not as much as ground burial when a lot, monument, vault and other cemetery expenses are considered. The Building is the monument far surpassing in size and beauty any other form of monument or memorial. The new Mausoleum will provide a family memorial and protected resting place combined that will afford infinite consolation when memories alone remain.

(3) This mode of entombment is both reasonable and scriptural. Our Lord Jesus Christ was laid to rest in a rock hewn tomb and early Christians followed this custom.

(4) Preparation is wisdom's cure for worry — the only cure. Insuring the house does not prepare it to burn, but prepares us to live without worry as to the ever present possibility of it burning. Providing for mausoleum protection is preparation to live without worry as to the ever present possibility of loved ones dying.

(5) It is an investment because when a Mausoleum is built in an area this size; all space is contracted for before it is built; therefore space is limited only to those who have bought.

The Company will provide a receiving vault in the event of death between the time of securing space and the completion of the Mausoleum. To protect and be protected to remember and be remembered a natural human desire — is reflected in the selection of a family burial place before the need for it arises. Buying before the time of actual need is the easier, wiser, kindlier way.
