But recently Honourable Members have pursued their work with more than usual diligence. This is for a variety of reasons, but most particularly because of such unusual happenings as the Dominion-Provincial Conference which opened in the Railway Committee Room of the House of Commons Monday morning last.

Council Raises Rates For Indigent Patients Rates paid for indigent patients in nursing homes and private hospitals in York County were increased at the November session of County Council on the recommendation of the Finance committee. The committee reported that the County subsidize local municipalities 50 percent of the net cost of nursing home care for indigent patients and that the per diem rate shall not exceed \$3.50. All applications for assistance must be approved by the warden and commissioners.

Stouffville Has Lowest Indigent Cost A report of the hospital costs of indigent patients in York County was presented to York County council at Newmarket. The figures, covering the first 9 months of the year, showed a decrease from those of last year but Warden W. J. Taylor warned that the final figures for the year will exceed last year's.

United Church Seeks Million for Relief United Church of Canada congregations across Canada will in December be asked to give half a million dollars to aid the needy in Canada and overseas. The half million dollar gift is part of a \$6,000,000 goal of The United Church's Missionary and Maintenance Fund which finances the church's own projects at home and overseas.

General Impression Gained from the Conference was that perhaps for the first time in many years the Dominion Government was prepared to listen to the needs of the 10 Provinces. One highlight of the Conference was the brief presented by Premier Frost of Ontario, which while it stated former and sound principles was noteworthy for the tone of confidence it showed in Canada's development.
