## Dairy Farmers Find That Advertising Pays Dividends

Answering the charge that farmers are always asking for help, Dairy Farmers of Canada, the national producers' organization, points to the three million dollars of their own money that farmers have put into advertising during the past eight years.

Officials of the producer organization explain that it has cost farmers who have participated, an average of about 30 cents per cow per year to play an important part in keeping their milk and milk products before the consumer.

If all dairy farmers had participated in the program, which is financed by a set-aside deduction of a cent-a-pound on butterfat marketed during the month of June, about five million dollars would have been available for advertising during the last eight years.

Producers in various parts in Canada who have been supporters of the program have recommended in recent years that the basis of set-aside be increased so that promotion might be stepped up.

Moving on to the solid accomplishments of their national advertising and promotion program, Erle Kitchen said that the program has had a subsidiary effect in helping to weld together the 36 member producer groups which go to make up Dairy Farmers of Canada, of which he is secretary-manager. He said the advertising program was a continuing, tangible project which was paying off for the dairy farmer and the industry at large.

In the Junior Section (under 12 years), there were four entries and Don Matthews Jr. was the winner. In the Senior section (12 to 20 inclusive), Beverley Burr showed her way to first place over nine other entries.

At the conclusion of the group classes, Mr. Art McEwen, President of the Jersey Club, called upon Mr. Jas. Bremner to present the trophies and specials. The Edgelea Challenge Trophy donated by Alfred Bagg was won this year by Cline Burr & Sons of Gormley. Alfred Bagg & Sons were recipients of the Eatons of Canada Special for the most points in the show.
