Entrance Hall Can Be Family Room

Transforming an ugly duckling entrance hall into a modern family room may be easier and less expensive than you think. One such project was undertaken in an old home with an ornate, dust-catching staircase. The job was completed without ripping out any structural parts of the home.

Given Modern Look—The key to the relatively inexpensive conversion was the camouflage technique. The unsightly old staircase was given a smart, modern look by the simple expedient of encasing it in textured plywood paneling. The paneling then was painted in a beige color with a red trim.

An ornate doorway was similarly covered with plywood. The designers point out that their technique in using plywood paneling in this way can also be adopted by the home craftsman in a variety of projects.

An important part of the ugly duckling-to-glamor transformation was achieved in the flooring. The old, worn wooden flooring was covered with rubber tiles.

Pick Rubber Tiles—Rubber tiles were chosen for the heavy-traffic family room, the designers say, because of its resiliency and its noise-muffling, long-wearing characteristics. The old floor was prepared for the new covering first by thoroughly removing all dirt, wax and old paint. Loose boards were repaired, all protruding nails were countersunk with a nail punch—and cracks and holes were filled with patching.
